<p>Subgroup Reports</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Data/QI Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) <u>SETRAC Data Review</u> <p>The Quarter 3 2017 data was reviewed by the committee. A larger number of STEMIs were seen at hospitals, possibly due to Hurricane Harvey.</p> <p>Of the number of patients transferred in, about half received treatment within the guidelines. There continues to be an opportunity to improve on the use of lytics.</p> <p>A suggestion was made to provide non-PCI centers and free-standing emergency rooms with a letter stating the ACC guidelines regarding the use of lytics for STEMI patients that are unable to receive PCI within 120 minutes.</p> <p>The current data being tracked is for PCI centers only. If a PCI center has a patient that needs to be transferred out for PCI, that hospital is considered to be a non-PCI center in that instance and should not be counted by the referral hospital in the total STEMI numbers. The patient will be included in the numbers by the hospital that performs the PCI.</p> 	<p>The topic of lytics administration will be brought to the GETAC Cardiac Care Committee for a recommendation, which SETRAC can use in a letter to non-PCI centers and freestanding emergency rooms to encourage the use of lytics.</p> <p>The Committee will look into a report that can be used for non-PCI centers to use regarding the transfer patients.</p>	<p>Standing report.</p>



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<p>b) <u>Database Roll-Out</u> A presentation given of the new database and future capabilities. Hospitals are asked to enter Quarter 4 2017 data for STEMI in the current database. Beginning with the January data, the information will be entered into the new database.</p>	<p>Ms. Farquhar will send an e-mail through the list serve about entering data in to the new database. A questionnaire will be included about technical capabilities for hospitals to complete.</p>
