Support Stop the Bleed Initiative	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 30 hospitals have trainers / 6 hospitals have purchased training supplies • 22 of 38 Independent School Districts have had staff or students trained • To date, 269 classes have been reported in the region • To date, approx. 11,500 have been trained • For Jan-April 2019 - 46 classes reported with over 3,500 people trained • National STB Month – May 2019 – 5-large public classes scheduled in the region for May 18, 2019 • Proclamation Certificates received in support of National STB Month by State of Texas Governor, Harris County Judge, City of Houston Mayor, Walker County Judge <p>Need more active trainers in region and full participation from stakeholders to submit all regional STB trainings. Stakeholders now able to submit their trainings on the SETRAC website.</p> <p>Connect with all school districts (including charter and private schools) to offer trainings</p>

MH, TCH, Harris Health, and HCA are working on IRB approvals. • Potential research on Stop the Bleed implementation and its effect on the region

Year to Date Committee Highlights:

- **Data Registry / Complications Workgroup** – Working with CDM and the mandated data reporting change through IDTX

- **Trauma Plan** – Pages 1-15 have been updated. A workgroup has met twice to address:
 - Activation Criteria (streamline across region)
 - Prehospital Trauma Plan (Adult and Pedi)
 - Awaiting possible new guidelines from GETAC in June

- **Designated Trauma Hospitals Update:**
 - Level I Adult – 2 Hospitals
 - Level I Pediatric – 2 Hospitals
 - Level II – 3 Hospitals
 - Level III – 8 Hospitals
 - Level IV – 11 Hospitals
 - In Active Pursuit (higher designation) – 2 Hospitals
 - In Active Pursuit (Initial designation) – 6 Hospitals (2 pedi)

Issues/Concerns for Board Attention: Data Subcommittee is assessing transfer data. An action plan will be considered with group input if transfer volumes appear excessive.
