CALL TO ORDER

Chris Collier called the meeting to order and welcomed the attendees. Mr. Collier reminded everyone to sign in in order to get credit for participation.

INTRODUCTIONS

Tonya Carter was introduced as the newest member of the SETRAC staff. She will be assisting Amy lademarco with the clinical service lines.

DSHS EMS COMPLIANCE 6/5S UPDATE

Beginning in 2020, MICU ambulances will be required to have a transmitting 12-lead capability cardiac monitor/defibrillator. A handout with the new rule was provided to the committee. A copy will also be sent out via email.

CEO UPDATE

The state legislature is now in session in Austin. Cory Chapman, who was unable to attend this meeting, will be at the EMS Committee meeting in March to discuss a united EMS effort to retain funding for EMS. The Driver Responsibility Program (DRP), which provides some funding for trauma systems, is expected to be abolished in this session; however, one of the three bills to remove the DRP has an approach that includes funding for trauma. Rep. Greg Bonnen (Angleton) is the Speaker of the House and Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick is the President of the Senate. The state has yet to organize the committees.

This year will be Dr. Ken Mattox's last term serving as the SETRAC Board Chair. He will continue for one year in an emeritus role to serve as an advisor to the new board chair, who will be elected in June.

NEW RAC BY-LAWS / RESTRUCTURE

SETRAC Board passed revisions to the by-laws at the October board meeting. One revision requires each committee to have a physician, EMS, and hospital representative that will serve as leaders.

The by-laws also no longer require stakeholders to attend board meetings for meeting participation requirements. Stakeholders will need to attend six meetings per year in addition to paying dues and submitting data. EMS agencies will need to attend three EMS Committee meetings along with three other meetings during the fiscal year, which can be additional EMS Committee meetings, board meetings, other service line meetings (trauma, stroke, cardiac), etc.
