<p>Presenter: Dr. David Weisoly Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes</p>	<p>Dr. Weisoly welcomed the group and acknowledged UTMB Clear Lake Campus as a new hospital within RAC Q.</p> <p>The meeting minutes were approved as written.</p>	<p>The committee has no further recommendations</p>
<p>Presenter: Dr. Weisoly Topic: SETRAC Database and Data Dictionary Q&A</p>	<p>In Feb 2019 SETRAC database with data dictionary was dispersed via the list serve. Updated version dispersed via list serve in April. Due date for data submission July 2018 - December 2018 has been extended to June 15, 2019. Questions can be submitted to Jon Fry or SETRAC team. Noted every perinatal care region is required to submit quality metrics to the State. SETRAC submits aggregated data to the state on behalf of the hospitals. Goal is to improve aggregate data. Hospitals will receive direct report. Opportunities to improve quality of care throughout the region. Workgroup goals and projects should be brought to Perinatal Committee for approval.</p> <p>Dr. Weisoly brought attention to double counting patients when submitting data. Example: baby born on December 30th with a 5 day LOS. Will be a 1 for late preterm birth in Dec. 2 days in Dec and 3 days in Jan as numbers are incident based.</p> <p>FAQ document will be developed. After June 15th, regular schedule for data submission will be developed.</p>	<p>Develop FAQ document</p>
<p>Presenter: Memorial Hermann - TMC Topic: Post-Partum Hemorrhage</p>	<p>Kendra Fohl presented on Quantitative Blood Loss on behalf of Patti Heale. Projects are around the TexasAIM collaborative. 6 week QBL pilot program Feb 12th – March 26th. Barriers: Pod format, staff nurse buy-in, physician buy-in, time to calculate QBL, original graduate drape. Results: 27 participants and 100% of patients were over or under-estimated for blood loss. 12,000ml of underestimated blood loss. Future Plans: Second PDCA, new graduated drape, and update process based on nursing and physician input. Inductions were also tracked. Currently performing an analysis on inductions to see how they come into play.</p>	<p>The committee has no further recommendations</p>

Found complications performing QBL while transitioning with baby. OB and anesthesia are involved in drills.</p>	
<p>Presenter: Dr. David Weisoly Topic: NCTRAC Admission Euthermia Project Intro</p>	<p>NCTRAC QI project reviewed. Will be presented at the Pediatric Academic Society (PAS). Requested the document remain confidential. Noted the large impact on outcomes. Admission euthermia eradicated in over 25,000 NICU babies and 156,000 plus well babies. Noted QI workgroup to develop a process for all 22 PCRs.</p>	<p>The committee has no further recommendations</p>

Texas NICU project from HHS pointed out significant needs for improvement regarding massive variation in brain imaging (MRI) in low birthweight and late pre-term infants. Evidence based guidelines published in regards to newborns. Will rewrite and send a Survey Monkey. Will use data to disseminate guidelines to aide in decisions to perform MRIs on infants.</p>	<p>Follow up on MRI Survey Monkey</p>

Survey received 16 responses from denominator of 40.</p> <p>Texas Children’s Hospital The Woodlands has partnered with review board for Safe Sleep Coalition.</p> <p>Goal reviewed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create an electronic safe sleep toolkit by end of year available to all SETRAC members for staff and family education. • Audit tool with place to post AAA video and FAQ for staff communication and education. 	<p>The committee has no further recommendations</p>
<p>Presenter: Dr. Eugene Toy Topic: Maternal Mortality Workgroup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Depression Screening • Drug Abuse Screening 	<p>Maternal mortality presentation reviewed. Noted decrease in all countries for maternal mortality. Noted half of deaths were pregnancy related with large opioid overdoses.</p> <p>Black women were more likely than white women to experience pregnancy-related deaths in 2012. Hypertension was high risk symptom. Hemorrhage is large cause of morbidity. 65% occur outside of hospital.</p> <p>Causes of mortality: #1 opioid overdose. #2 suicide.</p> <p>Every hospital in region has been asked to screen for depression and opioid substance abuse. Dr. Epps has applied for grant for Harris County for opioid addiction resources.</p> <p>Baseline Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Survey hospitals to see which screening is used and if its validated. • Implement screening using validated tool. • Develop toolkit through workgroup. Tool will be modified to fit additional EMRs. • Surveys will be sent every 3 months. • Identify and monitor high risk patients. <p>May possibly distribute to all RACs upon approval.
