SETRAC Trauma Data Registry Data Request Packet

Registry Overview

The SETRAC Trauma Registry is comprised of data that is submitted by designated Level I, Level II, Level II, Level III, Level IV, IAP, and Non-Designated trauma facilities. These facilities submit data to the SETRAC registry on a quarterly basis and follow a 30 day extension of the ACS's TQIP submission calendar using the National Trauma Data Standards and dictionary definitions in relation to abstraction elements.

It should be noted that not every injured person taken to or admitted by an SETRAC area hospital qualifies to be entered into the SETRAC Trauma Registry. The following NTDS guideline is the definition of "trauma patient" for the purposes of inclusion in the SETRAC Trauma Registry:

A: At least one of the following injury diagnostic codes defined as follows: International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision (ICD-10-CM): S00-S99 with 7th character modifiers of A, B, or C ONLY. (Injuries to specific body parts initial encounter) T07 (unspecified multiple injuries) T14 (injury of unspecified body region) T20-T28 with 7th character modifier of A ONLY (burns by specific body parts – initial encounter) T30-T32 (burn by TBSA percentages) T79.A1-T79.A9 with 7th character modifier of A ONLY (Traumatic Compartment Syndrome)

B: Excluding the following ICD-10-CM isolated injuries:

- S00 (Superficial injuries of the head)
- S10 (Superficial injuries of the neck)
- S20 (Superficial injuries of the thorax)
- S30 (Superficial injuries of the abdomen, pelvis, lower back and external genitals)
- S40 (Superficial injuries of shoulder and upper arm)
- S50 (Superficial injuries of elbow and forearm)
- S60 (Superficial injuries of wrist, hand and fingers)
- S70 (Superficial injuries of hip and thigh)
- S80 (Superficial injuries of knee and lower leg)
- S90 (Superficial injuries of ankle, foot and toes)

C: Hospital admission as defined by individual trauma hospital registry inclusion criteria; OR

D: Patient transfer via EMS transport from one hospital to another hospital; OR

E: Death resulting from the traumatic injury

Data Timeframe

Data collection in the SETRAC Trauma Registry began in calendar year 2015 and continues through today. However, because data submission deadlines are 120 days after the end of the quarter in which a patient was injured, real-time data is not available for disbursement.
