| Objectives | Assess the ability of Regional Healthcare Preparedness Coalition (RHPC) to establish and maintain communications with the coalition members in the event of a region-wide communications disruption. |
| Threat or Hazard | Communication Failure |
| Scenario | A powerful Geomagnetic storm caused the disruption of multiple communications systems across southeast Texas. The solar flares associated with this storm also caused a disruption of the power grid. |

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ANALYSIS OF HPP CAPABILITIES

<u>Objective 1 – Assess the ability of the Regional Healthcare Preparedness</u> <u>Coalition (RHPC) to establish and maintain communications with the</u> <u>coalition members in the event of a region-wide communications disruption.</u>

HPP Capability – Health Care and Medical Response Coordination – Full Capability

Strengths

- 1. The Healthcare Coalition identified the need to establish alternate methods of communication with members of the Regional Health Care Preparedness Coalition (RHPC).
- 2. Area HAM Radio Operators were readily available and willing to assist in the drill.
- 3. Dialysis Centers participated in large numbers.
- 4. 148 partner agencies were capable of communicating with SETRAC. Communication methods included HAM Radio transmissions, Mobile Data Transmissions (not cellular phone calls), and Satellite to Satellite phone calls.

Area for Improvement

- 1. Encourage the local HAM operators to attend SETRAC Coalition meetings.
- 2. Large numbers of text messages coming into SETRAC identified the need to have additional numbers available for partners to communicate through.
- 3. Provide training to agencies on the different means of communications to include their capabilities and individual requirements to operate.
- 4. Conduct the Off the Grid Drills semi-annually.
