CEO Update

SETRAC has tentatively received approximately \$340,000 from the state and is looking into how to best use it. Ideas in consideration include expanding use of whole blood in the region, expanding data, and a study on responder behavioral health with the University of Houston (UH). Pilot agencies would be needed for the UH project which is geared toward targeting problems and develop programs that would help responders.
