Friday, May 15, 2020 SETRAC Virtual Meeting

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CALL TO ORDER

John Kowalik called the meeting to order and welcomed the meeting attendees.

INTRODUCTIONS

Department of State Health Services (DSHS) EMS Compliance 6/5s Update

CEO Update

Darrell Pile provided an update on the regional COVID-19 response.

Testing at nursing homes is currently taking place. There is a need for teams of 8 or more people to be assembled with the state public health officials to help conduct testing and may even lead to cleaning of some facilities. Our EMTF forces are included in this endeavor. Please contact Chris Collier or Jon Clingaman if your agency has staff that could join a team.

Many hospitals are reporting a decrease in the amount of stroke and cardiac cases in the region which is also being seen on a national level. EMS agencies have seen an apparent decrease in run volume and a possible increase in the number of declined transports and severity of patient conditions which may be due to patients having a fear of acquiring COVID in ambulances and/or hospitals. There is an immediate need for simple statistics to see if this is true and to help the public be better assured and more comfortable in knowing that going to the hospital makes sense for acute care. Money from the local projects grant or SETRAC monies could be used to hire a professional company to develop a media campaign for this topic.

Mr. Kowalik suggested each agency submit data from January through April/May as soon as possible to SETRAC regarding stroke and STEMI call volumes as well as overall call volumes to determine if there is a regional trend with agencies. The committee discussed this topic and the data points that should be collected including transport denials and patients that are dead on scene. A conference call will be scheduled for the early part of next week to discuss the data to be collected, data definitions, and frequency of collection as well as a training call for how agencies can obtain this data.

A suggestion was made to contact media representatives to do a short interview to encourage the community to seek help immediately for stroke and STEMI symptoms. Mr. Pile encouraged the committee to consider what the message should be from a patient perspective. The committee suggested that in addition to having a spokesperson (such as Dr. Persse) to get the ball rolling, a representative from the committees (EMS, stroke, cardiac) and different hospitals and agencies as well as patients should appear in the campaign to show a united front.
