

Friday, July 17, 2020 SETRAC Virtual Meeting

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<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> - John Kowalik called the meeting to order and welcomed the meeting attendees.

INTRODUCTIONS - No introductions were made.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES (DSHS) EMS COMPLIANCE 6/5S UPDATE - No updates were provided.

CEO UPDATE - Darrell Pile provided an update on the regional COVID-19 response.

- Hospitals continue to report data and are voluntarily letting SETRAC know if there are delays for patients to be admitted to a general or ICU bed. This will continue to be tracked to assess if the number of beds available in the region meet the currents demands (which at this time they are not.)
- The military opened 35 beds at United Memorial Medical Center (UMMC) to admit pre-approved patients from other facilities. All referrals must be requested through the CMOC and will be based on certain criteria and UMMC being able to accept the patient at that time. Also, core group of hospitals have agreed to accept patients from other facilities on a rotating basis when the referring hospital has exhausted all other means of being able to transfer patients.
- Receipt of PPE to distribute to healthcare facilities has been steady.
- Data reported by SETRAC is collected directly from reporting facilities and may differ from TMC due to the way the data is collected/calculated.
- EMS agencies should continue to rely on EMResource for hospital availability status to determine where to take patients. SETRAC is working with the military to assist hospitals that are currently saturated with patients. COVID patients could be transferred to "medical resorts" to recover to help free up hospital space. SETRAC is working with a developer to provide a way for EMS agencies to view in EMResource how many ambulances are waiting at the hospital, how many are en route, average wait time, and how many were received at the facility over the past 2 hours.
- DSHS has contracted with agencies to bring a little over 400 nurses and clinicians to our region to help meet the staffing needs of hospitals so they can open additional beds. Some EMS regulations are being relaxed during the pandemic such as only having one certified clinician per truck and the trucks being able to be driven by anyone the agency's medical director credentials.
- Newman and Newman, a local marketing agency, has been hired by SETRAC to create a public messaging campaign. The "Make the Call" message will be seen on billboards, ads, and social media to inform the community that it is safe to be in an ambulance and hospital and to call 9-1-1 to seek immediate medical help. Funds from SB500 can be used toward the cost of the campaign. The campaign will be presented at the SETRAC board meeting on Monday, July 20th for approval. Data collected from regional EMS agencies show a decline from March to April in the number of overall EMS calls, patient transfers, and stroke and STEMI alerts. The data also shows an increase from March to April in the number of patients where resuscitation was performed and patients that were dead on scene. One possible reason for these numbers could be due to the lockdown order for Harris County.

• Trauma Committee Update Data received by SETRAC shows that EMS tourniquet usage has increased by 57% and the mortality rate for patients arriving via EMS with tourniquets applied has decreased by 60%. This data as well as other data particular to EMS will be compiled into a report for EMS to view.
