Presenter: Rebecca Crocker/Brett Dodwell Topic: Trauma Data Registry Subcommittee Update	Currently working on dashboard to use as review at this committee. CDM will send re-request of 2018 data to ensure additions and/or deletions are included. NTDB sent email with new inclusion criteria that will begin in 2020. Any transfer must now be included, not only EMS. This changed occurred due to standardize the process. Injury up to 14 days is new criteria. Education needs: Discussed TETAF data mgmt, ATS, AAAM, ICD 10 coding, an CDM course at TCH. Data Release Form: TQIP IV ABX will be added to form as well as acknowledge line. Once changes are made, it will be brought to this committee for approval, then to Board for approval. Applicable sponsor should be specified. This form and process was submitted in Feb 2018. Presenter: Garrett Hall Topic: Pediatric Committee Update	Pedi committee meets at SETRAC. All are welcome to attend. EMS and Nursing CEs offered at the meetings. Working on best practice white papers for the region. Do not have to be a pediatric center to participate. Dates and times of the next meetings are posted on the website. The new TQIP fee schedule is now \$19,570 for level I and II facilities.	The committee has no further recommendations



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Presenter: Dr. Michelle McNutt Topic: Injury Prevention Committee Update	Would like to get out to the TMDs and the level I and II facilities. Standardizing 4 activation criteria. Document reviewed. Blood transfusion activation approved by committee. Pre-hospital tourniquet: Some level II facilities do not activate trauma team when tourniquet is used. Melanie noted in May there were 10 activations and 8 went directly from ED to OR. Pelvic Fracture with Binder: Unstable pelvic fracture is a vague definition. This can be subject of community outreach education. Rebecca Crocker to reach out to LifeFlight to ask if they can report this at the EMS Committee. Noted EMS having concerns regarding why the application of public binder is necessary. Will move forward with this and flag outliers. Recommended changing wording to "pelvic injury requiring stabilization device". GSW to extremities: ACS removed this in Aug 2018. This is in the brachial and femoral artery area. This is for highest level of activation. Level I and II facilities only. SETRAC to send to the level I and II TPMs to send to TMDs. Will include the pediatric listserver.	Rebecca Crocker to contact LifeFlight to discuss definition of unstable pelvic binder SETRAC to send activation criteria to Pediatric listserver and Level I and II TPMs to share with TMDs.
Presenter: Jessica Vickers Topic: Stop the Bleed Committee Update	Will separate region into quadrants and identify all hospitals within the quadrants. Will have a liaison for each whom Kat can send requests to. Can sign up for multiple quadrants. Will send to hospitals within their quadrant. Goal is October 2019. If unable to find someone within the quadrant to teach, request will go out to all quadrants. House Bill 496 has passed requiring schools to have STB training and kits. TEA has until October 1st to decide which program to use. Noted this will take effort from all instructors to teach all schools. State of Texas has funded \$9.51 per student for training. Principals have been informed that utilizing in school resources. 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	sites open to all educators and staff. Open to 100 per session every week beginning the end of October through the end of December. This is an annual training. Humble ISD police officers are now signing up to teach classes. The region has a database of trainers, however only 6 hospitals and 10 EMS agencies report the training data. Link is on the website for the instructor to provide. Rebecca to follow up on Memorial Hermann STB data. Kat is able to provide information on kits upon request. Worked with approved vendors for reduced cost on school kits with chest seals and emergency blankets. ACS will make specific slides for Texas that includes the chest seal and blanket. SETRAC has kits available with 50 tourniquets and 2 wound packers inside. SETRAC now has 8 kits that can be checked out for training.
