Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Andrew Hiriart called the meeting to order. The minutes from the meeting on November 5, 2020 were approved with no changes.	Minutes approved with noted changes
Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Q2 2020 Data Review	Pedi Data: Top Ten Mechanism of Injury: Inquired about a drill down on ped Motor Vehicle Occupant injuries by the Injury Prevention Committee. Noted this is being addressed. TCH has a robust program and provides a lot of car seat checks. John Coley to contact Kristen Beckworth regarding county data to review trends to include, increases, decreases, front seat vs rear seat, seasonal data, etc. Will reach out to Injury Prevention Committee for potential partnership if needed. 2021 Burn Data: 2021 data dictionary will not include isolated burns in the trauma registries. Burn data will be put into burn specific registries as ACS has taken burns out of trauma. HCA will continue collecting burn data. Noted drill down was performed in the past and found patients were triaged appropriately. Proposed removal of burn data for review with the understanding that data can still be reviewed upon request but will not be a complete view of RAC as many hospitals will no longer enter the data. Members approved and seconded the decision to go to Trauma Committee for approval. Adult Data: Level by ISS: Reached out to CDM regarding "missing" ISS. May be due to failing error that were not corrected. Non-specific injuries can be coded to .9 when there is not enough information for a specific code. Some level IV facilities are rural and transfer out often so may not have proper documentation. Some data shows mortality % without ISS. 66 "missing" from level IV facilities. Noted no HCA facilities are currently missing ISS. Basic ISS should be easily available. Andrew and Stephen to develop blanket education for injury reporting and physician documentation. Goal for rollout is Q2 2021. ISS with Mortality Rate: Noted non-designated outlier at 2.1%. Inquired about the protocol for EMS CPR in progress/airway? 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	nearest trauma center? Goal is to go to a trauma facility but can go to nearest facility. Hospital Arrival Method: 16 Not Documented for level I facilities. Requested level I facilities go back and review the “not documented” entry for Hospital Arrival Mode. Transfer In vs Outcome: Transfer data is reviewed to ensure patients aren’t transferred to non-designated facilities and expiring.
