Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Stephen Mora called the meeting to order. Presenter: Stephen Mora Topic: "It's Only A White Line" Program – Data Points	Stephen Mora gave an update on the White Line initiative from the last meeting. Scenarios were given of fatalities of two mothers stopping on the freeway to check on their children in a minor accident resulting in their deaths and a Good Samaritan stopping to render aid to a stranded motorist getting hit and seriously injured. There was an article in the Houston Chronicle dated January 24, 2022, that stated "More drivers die outside disabled vehicles in Texas than anywhere else in the country. For the full story google Houston Chronicle January 24, 2022. This is still occurring in the region and county. Discussion was had by Stephen and Stacie Drake regarding the amount of data needed to be collected and for how long it would take to get an accurate count. Stacie advised it will take about 5 years of research or a project to collect the data. 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	- Death by Location – 18 patients in “not applicable” category. All deceased patients should have a location. Pedi Data Summary - Trauma Level by Month – Will correct with addition of level I data in next quarter. Will see that trend change - Total Volumes by Quarters (Q1 2021-Q3 2021) Consistent across each level. Level IVs have slightly higher numbers possibly due to geographical location. - Level by ISS – Goal – Level IVs correct missing ISS - Will do a deeper drive. - ISS with Mortality Rate – Looked at the Covid data for the first time in the reports will probably have to tweak it a little. - Top 5 Mechanisms of Injury – “natural environment” has dropped from top 5 due freeze and not freeze temps - Hospital Arrival Method – Possibly begin including the ISS score for ground and private transport method as Grace mention before. - Transfer In vs Outcome – Transfer into level IVs possible due to family choice. - Death by Location – Only 1 “Not Applicable” noted in report.

There are several topics in mind and will be narrowed down with some topics being for hours, thirty minutes, or as short as fifteen minutes. Gara Hall with ESO will be coming to speak on all the changes that they are getting ready to release in waves and their ideas for what the new ESO registry will look like. More information to come. SETRAC has a platform that has been used in the past and hopefully can be used for registering for the workshop. Tonya will use it to track registration attendance and RSVPs whether virtual or in person. They are looking at different avenues to try to get CEs available. It's very important especially with the new not orange, grey book that is coming out from the ECS where registers will have specific CE requirements for registry. We are working very hard to get CEs approval for the event so people can utilize it as the new book will be out at that point and the CEs can be used as part of registry required CEs. Complications Dashboard Update – Chris/Rebecca Deferred - Have not met for the complications. Both had some surveys hopefully they will have an update for the next meeting. On another note: Houston NW successfully completed their ACS survey and are officially designated a level 2 as of this month. Presenter: Brett Dodwell / Erin Fox Topic: Research Workgroup Trauma Research Workgroup Update	Not too much to update as they do not have an active project in the research workgroup. The last project was the level 2 impact in the RAC and the Stop She Bleed presentation that was picked up by TQIP at the TQIP conference. Have a proposal for the White Line Project. This meeting, and previous meeting the research workgroup worked on manning and supporting the project and willing to start on an analysis. They are happy to take it on officially and formally. The other potential research group's attention project is on the agenda, Mechanism by Zip Code. There was discussion a few meetings back with the Trauma Committee with support to look at the top 5 zip codes in the RAC. 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	get a formal request for the research group to start that project and bring it up at the Trauma meeting and get a formal request from them as well. So, there are two projects 1) The White Line Auto Pad Stranded Motorist project and 2) Top Five Mechanisms by Zip Code. They are willing to take it on waiting on a formal request from both committees to officially start. Grace mentioned that they have put in a request through ESS to see if they can get the report on the Mechanism by zip code hopefully, they will have it soon.	
Open Discussion	At the last meeting Stephen Mora and Andrew Hiriart were Co-Chairs of the Trauma Data Registry Subcommittee. It was decided with Andrew's transition to Ben Taub and because the data touches so many different facilities it would probably be best to have a Co-Chair of another facility where they would not be from the same facility. Andrew is going to be Co-Chair representing the committee at Ben Taub. The Co-Chair position was opened to anyone interested. All interested was asked to reach out to Tonya or Grace for information on the responsibilities (deeper review of the data before the meetings, coming up with strategies, deeper dives to name a few). Tonya will get those who are interested in touch with Andrew Hiriart. Tonya will be putting together a calendar for national and regional awareness. A calendar of days and months representing special awareness such as (Child Abuse, Heart Awareness, Stroke Awareness, etc.) if anyone is aware of any awareness days and/or months for let her know so that she can put it on the calendar. The hope is to create a unified calendar around the days and months for awareness purposes where all hospitals can send out through their social media outlets.
