Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Andrew Hiriart called the meeting to order. The minutes from the meeting on March 3, 2022, were approved with no changes. Presenter: Andrew Hiriart/Grace Farquhar Topic: 2021 Data Review ○ Pediatrics ○ Adults	Andrew went over Quarters 1-4 2021 data starting with Pediatric. Thirty-three (33) facilities submitted data for a total of 4,631 pediatric records. Pediatric age is 15 years and younger. An overview was given on the different levels; Trauma level by month, total patients by designation, level by ISS, Injury severity score with mortality and the non-designated by levels, records missing ISS, Mortality percentage by designation level, and the top five mechanisms of injury. The top five mechanisms were shown the top three were (1) motor vehicle, (2) struck by against, (3) fire object substance. Missing ISS was discussed. Tonya and Grace will reach out to ESO regarding data submission mechanism. Looked at hospital arrival ISS vs arrival methods will have it for the next meeting. Comorbid by year and complications both heavily depended on understanding the ever-changing definitions and correct identification abstraction of the data. There were 28, 721 adult records from thirty-three (33) facilities the ages range from 16 and older. Patients 16 and older that are treated at a pediatric facility are included in the report. Transfer out by level looked good for adults. In the adult report there was no missing data or N/As. Will be doing education on both Comorbid and Hospital Complications at the RAC workshop to provide insight and understanding of definitions.	The committee has no further recommendations.
Presenter: Grace Farquhar Topic: New RAC Rules	DSHS is coming out with new rules for RACs. RACs will begin surveying themselves from 33 metrics that will have to score themselves ranging from 1 – 5. 1 not meeting the criteria and 5 exceeding the criteria. Its not just for Trauma its for all service lines. They are coming out with some specific metrics and general service of care in our region. They will be looking at mortality which we are looking at, discharge disposition and outcomes, how we are working not only with other hospitals and EMS but also local leaders, public health, other partners, and general public. 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	now, we have an extensive data collection but there are some holes that need filling that we may get from EMS to complete a picture, example; falls how many calls made for falls or for lift assistance that the patient does not get transferred to the hospital. EMS is open to suggestions to what this committee would like to see we can work with them to collect the information. Need to look at where the patients are going after discharge from hospital if they are not diseased. The rules will go into effect in 2023 we will need to do a survey at the end of the year to see how we have met all the criteria and in 2024 we will have to implement a performance improvement plan for the RAC for anything that is not a 3 or above. Think about what you, local leaders, and the community should know about and what would be of interest to them. Brett asked if they could get the RAC self-assessment tool. Grace advised it was and that it is currently being reviewed and not finalized its in draft form.	
Presenter: Rebecca Crocker Topic: Trauma Registrars Workgroup Update	Andrew gave the update for the Trauma Registrars Workgroup. They have been meeting regularly for a couple of months. A Registrars Workshop will be provided at the RAC on Friday, September 16, 2022, it will be an all-day event held in person or virtual from 7:30am – 4:30pm. Currently working on a save the date that will be going out on the listserv in a couple of weeks those on the call can mark your calendars. There will be about 7 or 8 lectures geared towards anyone involved in data, registrars, nurses, coordinators, trauma program managers, researchers, or anyone that abstracts data. There will be talks on: Pediatrics, ISS calculating, ISS scoring, ICU term, everything on accuracy in data collection, and discussions on validating data. The RAC has put this on in the past but had to put it on hold due to the pandemic we are happy to be bringing it back. Working on applying for CE credits for nurses and for non-clinical registry staff we are applying for nurses CEs open for nurses who abstract, do performance improvement it is open a wide audience. Do not know how many credits will be given working on it now. The event is free. Brett gave a reminder of the new state and ACS rules trauma specific education and the survey. Presenter: Brett Dodwell Topic: Trauma Research Workgroup Update ○ Torniquet Data Submission ○ Stop The Bleed	Research Workgroup had two potential projects in focus, the Stranded Motorist with Stacy Drake/TxDOT and the Top Five Injury Mechanisms by Zip Code. At the last Trauma Committee meeting they did not support proceeding with the Stranded Motorist project. The Research Workgroup is now focused on the Top Five Mechanisms of Injury within the RAC by Zip Code with potentially developing a heatmap. In discussion now with ESO on how to build it and how it is going to work. Brett did not think there was enough to justify a meeting today for the workgroup, so they did not meet. Going to have a meeting on the next Trauma Day at the RAC for the Research Workgroup. Tonya gave an update on the Torniquet data submission. A reminder email was sent out for the data due date of April 27. A large majority submitted their data. There may be one or two facilities that have not submitted. Stop the Bleed Texas Collation is having a day of Stop the Bleed, Thursday, May 19th online virtual back-to-back classes. SETRAC has been selected to provide an instructor to teach from 3:00pm-4:00pm. The governor has declared a proclamation "Stop The Bleed Day for Texas."
