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

Our Common Challenge

- Successful public health programs and services function largely in the realm of prevention
- But conveying the value of prevention can be a very difficult task
- The right quote, used at the right time, can be a very powerful means of communicating abstract prevention issues

Why Can Quotes Be So Impactful?

- Good wordsmithing
 - "People have an appetite for well-expressed wisdom"
- Motivational psychology
 - A concise message that conveys that YOU can do something, especially delivered by someone in a leadership position (leader, teacher, coach, mentor) can help establish self-efficacy
- Self selection
 - Not everyone is inspired by quotes
 - Some may feel that they are an oversimplification
 - But for many they can be well received because they are concise and resonate with a key point

- Very unscientifically

- I purposefully did not catalogue the commonly used quotes in the safety business, as I felt they have been a bit overused. For example "safety first"; "safety starts here"; "don't learn safety by accident"

- So here goes my personal Top 10, presented in no logical order.....



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- Context: Fatality while collecting wild animal species



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- Bonus quote another good one from risk management: "Frequency breeds severity"



- Topical area: Professional development training for safety staff
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- Administrative question: "What if we train them and they leave?"
- Retort quote: "What if we don't and they stay?"



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Bonus quote - this one can be also modified to read: "We don't live in the land of the healthy, we live in the land of the free"



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- Quote: "The customer doesn't need a ½ inch drill bit, the customer needs a ½ inch hole"



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- **Bonus quote: "Comparison is the mother of insight"**

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- Bonus quote: "Emery you don't get it – I was told: 'if it moves, salute it, if it doesn't move, paint it'"



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- Context: Cooperation with Federal law enforcement on training students, faculty, and staff on basic security controls especially with international collaborations
- Quote (from Federal Law Enforcement): "For you guys in the audience, when you travel abroad -- you don't magically get better looking"

- I had to Google this one up.....
 - "According to Greek mythology, Procrustes was a robber who killed his victims in a most cruel and unusual way. After capturing them, he made them lie on an iron bed and would force them to fit the bed by cutting off the parts that hung off the ends or by stretching those people who were too short. Something Procrustean, therefore, takes no account of individual differences but cruelly makes everything the same. A "procrustean bed" is a scheme or pattern into which someone or something is arbitrarily forced."
