Presenter: Dr. Brent Kaziny Topic: Old Business PECC Workshop	Dr. Kaziny spoke on the virtual PECC Workshop that was given a while back. He advised that they are in the process of ruling on a project of disseminating the workshop via online videos to increase the presence of PECC. The project has been primarily led by Teresa Strong. They are currently on a hold he and Dr. Davis will have updates next meeting.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Brent Kaziny Topic: New Business Emergency Center Committee	Dr. Kaziny spoke on the formation of the Emergency Center Committee for SETRAC. Dr. Kaziny advised he is interested in participating in the committee. He mentioned that Texas Children's has assigned their emergency center leads to participate. He asked if this was an avenue to share some education and trouble shoot every day pediatric readiness for emergency centers that are not housed in pediatric facilities and to push it like the PECC workshop. Carrman advised that they have had two meetings so far, the third one is scheduled for September 20 th Lori Upton the interim CEO leads the meetings and they have had 20+ people in the meetings. Dr. Kaziny advised If anybody is interested in joining the committee to reach out to Tonya or Carrman to get on the meeting invite. Dr. Kaziny would like later down the line to put on the agenda a potential venue for disseminating a pediatric best practice. He would like to hear from the committee after they get established, structured and have leadership in place if they would be interested in hearing some of the topic's pediatrics have. Carrman advised they are seeking leaders now for the committee. Grace gave a brief overview of what was discussed at the last meeting. A PowerPoint presentation was shown on the different committees within SETRAC (clinical committees, preparedness side of the house and EMS committee). The emergency center committee's focus is emergency preparedness since it is hurricane season and mental health patients. For the next meeting Lori will be reaching out to mental health facilities including some of the hospitals for a speaker on the subject. Grace advised they do not have to be in the emergency department to attend the meeting. Dr. Kaziny asked once the selected leaders are selected to let him know so he can see how the pediatric committee can support their work. Dr. Kaziny is excited to hear that the key focus of the emergency center is emergency preparedness and management because it is a huge part of what SETRAC does.	
Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Standing Report Q1-Q4 2021 Pediatric Data Review	Andrew went over all the 2021 data last meeting. He advised there was no new data to report currently. Grace mentioned that starting in August 2023 DSHS is requesting all regional advisory councils to start doing a self-assessment regarding trauma care and prehospital care. A lot of the things are already being done with pediatric data and trauma data but things like outcomes and rural verses urban, what the care in the regions look like, and improvements that need to be made is something to look at. All the reports that we receive from all our committees have been aggregate numbers. Regarding stroke and cardiac we are working with the American Heart Association agreements have been sent to the hospitals. DSHS wants the data broken down by different age groups. How it was before Pedi was 15 and under and adult 16 and older. Now the age groups are birth -1, 1-5, -6-14, 15-18, 19-25 and so on. It can be done with trauma data, but age has not been looked at with the other committees.	The committee has no further recommendations

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	great example instead of pediatrics being an afterthought or an appendix it is built into what other committees are working on whether looking at specific article guidelines or white papers for the region, etc. One of the things to put into the new business piece is the recent release of a federally funded Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) to develop a Pediatric Disaster Care Center of Excellence. Texas Children's is leading the grant application efforts partnering with SETRAC as a funded partner, Children's hospitals, trauma centers across the Gulf Coast, and Puerto Rico to develop a Gulf Coast approach to improving pediatrics disaster care. While the pediatric committee is much more than pediatrics disaster care there are many things embedded in the work done and if afforded the grant it would further the mission of the pediatric committee. The recipient of the grant application will be known in a month or month in a half. A lot of the work that SETRAC will be doing in part really furthers the mission that the committee has been outlining, developing PECCs in all region emergency centers and further collaboration with other committees, etc. Potential recommendations to include mental health in national standard and CMOC medical operation in times of extreme disasters. A transfer center for the region for patients that need psychiatric care instead of going to pediatric and emergency centers.	
Open Discussion	Dr. Kaziny is hopeful there will be an education offering at the next meeting. He gave an update on the PECC workshop and the joint venture grant application between SETRAC and Texas Children's hospitals across the country. Traffic Safety Grant is hosting education sessions. Tall Cop Says Stop offers a huge wealth of education on elicit or over the counter drugs. For those interested in the sessions reach out to Sarah Beth. Grace advised GETAC is having their quarterly meeting next week Wednesday in Austin they have a virtual option via Microsoft Teams as well. The pediatric meeting is Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. and Injury Prevention and Public Education at 1:00 p.m. Sarah Beth dropped the link in the chat. Sarah Beth mentioned that DSHS is hosting a Safe Riders Program webinar next week the coordinator is Marissa Rodriguez. It is a program on how to keep child passengers safe on the road. It is a good resource for anyone interested in getting a program started or potential funding. It takes very little administrative work on the backend, and it offers car seats to the area as well.
