Presenter: Dr. Brent Kaziny Topic: New Business - Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) Grant - Pediatric Disaster Care Center of Excellence	In August Texas Children's and Baylor College of Medicine led the application efforts to develop a new pediatric disaster care center of excellence a grant process that was first done in 2019 where 2 pediatrics disaster care centers of excellence located out of UCSF in California and out of Rainbow Babies in Ohio was funded. A grant application to create a third pediatrics disaster center of excellence was opened Dr. Kaziny along with internal team members at Texas Children's including Nicole Davis, an active participant in their education committee submitted the application it was approved they were awarded a 1 year 3-million-dollar grant. SETRAC was included in the application as a funded entity leading the initiatives facing healthcare coalitions. The grant forms the Gulf Seven Pediatric Disaster Network (G7) which includes Children's hospitals and hospitals from Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Florida, and Puerto Rico a Gulf Coast approach to improving pediatric disaster care. They will be having their first kick off meeting for their partners in a couple of weeks there will be more to come. SETRAC's involvement will be getting the healthcare coalitions throughout that region on board. The strength of SETRAC is their strong commitment to the pediatrics committee and pediatrician involvement at the higher level. They look to do similar things with other healthcare coalitions making sure pediatrics have a seat at the table.	The committee has no further recommendations



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Presenter: John Coley/Andrew Hiriart Topic: Standing Report Q1 2022 Pediatric Data Review	Total volumes by quarters were shown the numbers were lower than Q4 2021. There continue to be records with missing ISS scores, mainly from Level IV facilities. It will be addressed at the upcoming Trauma Registrars Workshop. Level by ISS - Level IV facilities have a higher number of ISS score patients possibly due to location and neuro capabilities. ISS with Mortality Rate - Level I facilities showed 7 mortalities all other facilities showed none. Mortality by age - will be reviewed to meet the criteria of the new RAC self-assessment in 2023. Age groups will be revised to reflect the self-assessment criteria. Top 5 Mechanisms of Injury - The struck by against and motor vehicle occupant categories have traded places back and forth over the years. Falls continue to be the leading cause of trauma. Future reports will include an age breakdown for the top 5 mechanisms of injury. Hospital Arrival Method – ISS will be added beginning with the Q2 2022 data reports. Transfer In vs Outcome – No mortalities were reported. Death by Location – This report will be removed unless the committee would like to continue to review the data.
