Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Andrew Hiriart called the meeting to order. The minutes from the meeting on September 1, 2022, were approved with one change. Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: New Business Q1-Q2 2022 Data Review	Andrew reported on Q1-Q2 2022 adult data (age 16 and older) that included data from 14,167 records from 33 participating facilities. Pediatric data will be presented at the January 5 th meeting. Trauma patient numbers continue to trend upward for Level I and IV facilities. There continues to be records with missing ISS scores mainly from Level IV facilities. Level IV facilities have a higher number of high ISS score patients due to location and neuro capabilities. The ISS with mortality rate data will be trended to review the mortality percentages for the higher ISS scores at lower designated facilities. The mortality by age report will be reviewed to meet the new RAC self-assessment criteria that will be implemented in 2023. The mechanisms of injury have not changed much over the years. ISS will start to be tracked for hospital arrival methods. Transfer In vs Outcome Level IVs have a higher number of patients transferred in than Level IIIs possibly due to patient choice and neuro capabilities. The death by location report has been discontinued as it was deemed unnecessary to review by the subcommittee. The medical examiner's office has recently changed leadership and has decided to no longer provide preliminary autopsies to hospitals.	The committee has no further recommendations.
