Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Andrew Hiriart called the meeting to order. The minutes from the meeting on May 5, 2022, were approved with no changes. Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: New Business ○ Introduction of New Subcommittee Co-Leader John Coley Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: New Business ○ RAC Rules Data Collection Grace Farquhar/Tonya Carter	John Coley, Trauma Nurse Coordinator at Texas Children's Hospital, west campus level 4 freestanding pediatric facility introduced himself. He has been a nurse for 10 years and in his present role for 5 years. The plan is for Andrew to manage and present the adult data and John the pediatric data. Andrew reported data at the last two pediatric meetings he is not sure if they will want a report every meeting. He advised John to get with Tonya and Grace to see if an update is needed at every meeting. DSHS has put out a RAC self-assessment scoring tool starting in August 2023 we will need to start implementing for trauma in our region. There will be about 33 different criteria that needs to be met ranging from 0 (not known/not doing anything) to 5 (upper chalan). They want all the RACs to go through each of the different criteria and grade themselves. We will need to meet at least a 3 in every criterion in order to meet those standards. If we fall below a 3, we will need to come up with a performance improvement project or an initiative to correct it. If we are meeting a 5 then they want us to put together something to help other RACs that may be struggling. Data will be involved things we will need to look at are outcomes and discharge disposition, how we are getting public health officials, county leaders, and EMS involved. As far as specific metrics go Grace will get with John to look at the pediatric data. We have been showing the data with 15 and under as pediatric and 16 and older as adult. Going forward we will need to break it down into different age groups (birth-1yr, 1-5, 6-14, 15-18, 19-25, 26-64, 65-84, and 85+). Will have to go back through the data and put them into the different age groups. Other demographics that will need to start tracking are zip codes, gender, race/ethnicity, whether bariatric or mental health patient, insured	The committee has no further recommendations. Andrew, John, Grace, and Tonya will meet to go over the data per the new age group before the next meeting



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	or uninsured. We will need to take a deeper dive into our data to look at specific areas as opposed to just general ISS. Grace, Lori, and Tonya went through all three different criteria and discovered that we are at least hitting a 3 on everything except in 4 areas. 1) Epidemiology 2) risk assessment, 3) getting public health officials involved by inviting them to our meeting along with the hospitals, 4) have everybody assist in completing an injury and disease risk assessment for the region which includes falls and self-afflicted firearm. We have this data we will need to look a little more into age group and location. This committee will need to look at what data is needed to fulfill the initiative of the trauma committee. What items are we not looking at that we need to look at? Tracking the things in the trauma plan, destination criteria, transport guidelines, and ISS scores for level 1 and 4 are some of the things to look into. Coming down the pipe is risk bands for EMS response that stay with the patient throughout their hospital visit. Andrew asked if there was a criterion that is specific for the data subcommittee. Grace advised notes were taken regarding the criteria for trauma and submitted to the trauma committee leaders.
