National Trauma Survivor Day is May 17th. Kristen Beckworth shared that Texas Children's Hospital relaunched their in-home safety curriculum presentations. They are offering free virtual and in person presentations in English and Spanish. In home safety is a broad topic covering safe sleep, some drowning prevention, safe storage, medication safety, etc. If interested reach out to Kristen Beckworth (klbeckwo@texaschildrens.org). Dr. Arredondo shared with the group a project he is a part of that educate physicians across the nation. The project is now in its second year as a national drowning prevention project. They have robust participation in Texas and gaining national recognition from pediatricians from Hawaii and Puerto Rico. Sarah Beth Abbott reported that Children's Memorial Hermann as a system dedicated funds from their CEO to purchase 10,000 firearm safety kits. The kits consist of information to parents on prevention as well as a babysitter notepad that include the question "is there an unlock gun in the house," poison control information, suicide crisis hotline number, the 988 system as well as a cable lock for firearm. They have started rolling it out from their campus. They have done events in the community they are looking for like minded partners to host events to distribute the kits in their communities. Last night was their second Rockets game. Dr. Arredondo thanked everyone for their efforts and hard work in helping to expand and increase the injury prevention efforts. Tonya Carter mentioned that all meetings going forward will be in person.
