The EMS Data Metrics The data metrics was discussed at the last meeting and forwarded over to SETRAC's EMS liaison who will work with the EMS committee and EMS agencies. SETRAC has hired someone to assist with the EMS program. They are working to see what data EMS want to see for themselves taking into consideration stroke, cardiac, and trauma data, and the suggestions that were made from the data subcommittee and other service lines, how feasible it is to get that information, and to make it as easy and efficient for our EMS partners to get good clean data. There will be more to come. Wake Up Stroke and Rehab Utilization There hasn't been much update since the last meeting. Grace will share the Q3 wake up stroke data at the next data meeting on February 22nd. They are close to finalizing the database upgrade they will be testing it this afternoon. There is some new metrics that they are still tweaking and hopefully will get it fixed by the end of the week and ready Monday. They are behind on the CEO reports they are putting together the tables to send out to everyone to review for Q1&2 of 2022. Once they send it out there will be 7 days to review and make any changes in the database. Grace thanked those who put their data in the database for Q3. If submitting data into GWTC and SETRAC has received your authorization to access your data SETRAC can pull that information for you. It is not an automatic pull. The plan is to download the information into a CSV file and then upload it into the database. It is ok if a facility wants to put the information in the database themselves. 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	first before uploading any data. If a facility wants SETRAC to pull it for them Grace will need an email letting her know their data is in GWTC and she will render the information for them. #18 DIDO field is turned off for right now. Dr. Rao advised that DIDO is one of the metrics to focus on as one of the key metrics of higher level of care. Even though it will not be measured at this time it is still important to track.	
Open Discussion	Stroke Bootcamp was discussed there have been two bootcamps in previous years that went over well. An overview with GWTC was given on how to enter and pull data. They also had a preconference offering an ENLS course for EMS and coordinators. Suggestions for the bootcamp Timeline - Fall preferably September. Invite speakers Offer CEMs, CEs, and CEUs credits Create an educational program format Record the bootcamp for collaboration and new hires Invite long term care providers to broaden the participation SETRAC will offer nursing and EMS CEUs and CEs. Dr. Rao will look into getting CMEs. Richard Engdorf, LaTriece Jones, Ericka Sirchia, Fiona Smith, and Catherine Bissell volunteered to help with the stroke bootcamp. Naylon Bird presented a table of contents from door to device best practice and asked the group how they were abstracting LVO DTD, DTP, and DTRp data. There was collaboration and clarification given. Jill Bricker announced that she would be leaving her position at UTMB, and this meeting is her last meeting with the group. She will be greatly missed.
