Presenter: Grace Farquhar Topic: New Business - SETRAC Data Repository-Stroke - GWTC Download Instructions - Excel Template for Non-GTWG Users - Data Dictionary Revisions - Q4 2022 Stroke Data Submission	Grace thanked everyone for their patience with updating the database and GWTC registry. The IRP with GWTC download, excel spreadsheet template, and the data dictionary revisions are not ready yet due to glitches. They are currently updating the database to fix the issues where data can be entered without an error message, providing an upload function, and the data download section for the new IRP GWTC. Grace put in a request with IQVIA to check into it. They advised it was a known issue that they were working on. Q4 2022 date is due February 28th but because of the change to the new IRP, some of the larger facilities that have a lot of patients, smaller ones that may not have the resources, stroke surveys, and learning curve with the new IRP with GWTC, and getting back on track with everything she proposed moving the deadline for the Q4 data submission to March 31st. Everyone agreed with the extension. They will revisit at the March meeting to see if there are still issues, they can look at extending the deadline to April due to the learning curve with the new system if warranted. Normally the Q4 2022 stroke data reports are presented at the stroke committee meeting in March they don't present in May. They will push the Q4 report from the March meeting to the May meeting. Once Grace can download the information from GWTC she will put together instructions, screen shots where to get information, what fields are needed, and the step-by-step process to download it. Those using GWTC she will send a spreadsheet that has the way the fields need to be named along with the data dictionary new field updates. Presenter: Grace Farquhar Topic: Old Business ○ Q3 Wake-Up Stroke ○ Rehab Utilization Review ○ Co-Leader Needed	Grace has been working on rehab utilization, but it's been a little difficult trying to get the information from the new IRP. She has been using the old system to download some of the information. The committee came up with initiatives to investigate such as rehab metrics to see how many patients utilized rehab in the region. Grace presented a general data chart from the rehab metrics showing patients that have come into a facility, ED, discharge disposition. She is still working on the chart. They would like to know where the stroke occurred. They are using zip code data for education purposes, and to see if there is a specific area where rehab is being utilized and not. As they start to get further into the new RAC surveys they will start looking at things like urban vs rural, treatment given, what follow up look like, social needs, and payment source. Right now, the focus is trauma and EMS and eventually stroke. Grace have categorized the zip codes so far by county and state not rural and urban. They can set up a small workgroup if a group would like to investigate. Once they have something more finalized, narrowed down they will share with the stroke committee. It's still in the working stages. Tentatively they plan to have something to show at the September stroke committee meeting. Wake-Up Strokes The main reason they wanted to look at wake-up-stroke is over the years almost 70% of patients that arrive at the ED arrive over 4.5 hours of LKW and it hasn't changed. They want to know the why, how many patients have come in under 4.5 hours, and how many came in 4.5-24 hours LKW. Age group, gender, race, ethnicity, arrival method are also things they are looking at.
