Presenter: Dr. Kevin Schulz Dr. James McCarthy Topic: New Business ○ Presentation from Genentech ○ GETAC Update	The Genentech presentation was not presented at this meeting as Suzanne Dominey was not able attend. David Bernard announced there was no update on GETAC at this time as Dr. McCarthy wasn't in attendance. There was no other new business mentioned.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Carrie Boyd Topic: STEMI Coordinator Subcommittee ○ Co-leader Needed	Carrie Boyd stated there was a meeting earlier this week, they received updates on Data metrics and CEO reports. Grace advised, they are looking at data metrics that need to be collected from free standing and some long-term facilities. Information was sent to the facilities. They have until February 8, 2023, to get the information in. The plan is to get some good data to present at the next meeting.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Kevin Schulz Topic: Education Workgroup ○ Cardiac Care Education Series	Dr. Schulz mentioned there has been movement and discussion for a collaboration between CPR outreach and STB to create a small workgroup. The goal is to have volunteers to do some form of training specifically with high school sports and to host different events in the Houston area. Some members gave additional suggestions and ideas. The Coach Stevens Foundation was mentioned as something to look that is impactful and meaningful. Dr. Schulz asked for any volunteers that might be interested in participating and teaching in events related in CPR, STB or any other events that might be impactful. Presenter: Grace Farquhar Cynthia Hernandez Topic: Standing Reports ○ Q4 2022 Regional Data Review	Grace thanked Cynthia Hernandez for assisting with leading the data group. Grace also announced Olga Ortega will be assisting as well. Cynthia presented on the Q4 2022 Regional Data. Hospital data submissions were reviewed. Data submissions has declined significantly. 2 facilities submitted partial data; 6 facilities did not submit any data.	The committee has no further recommendations

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	Cynthia mentioned reaching out to the administration of different facilities to see who is responsible for submitting your data. If anyone having any issues with submitting data, reach out to Grace directly for assistance. Total STEMIs continue to trend down compared to pre-pandemic numbers. While the overall trend remains level, arrival of STEMI patients by EMS (911) for Q4 2022 is a slight trend up from Q3, however still trending down from previous quarters because some hospital data is still missing. Direct presentation patients receiving PCI continue to receive D2B within 90 minutes (or with acceptable reasons for delay) well above the regional 90% goal. This percentage of transfer patients' w/DIDO<30 mins is still well below the regional goal of 75% and is slowly trending downward. The collection of patient level data (no PHI) will assist in determining what factors may be impacting these numbers. Lytics administration rates at referring facilities continues to be low. While lytics administration rates are trending downward, the administration rate for Q4 2022 is slightly higher than the previous quarter. SETRAC is currently working on a more efficient way to collect data for reporting time metrics (median DIDO, D2B, first medical contact, etc.) and to meet the requirements that will be required with the new RAC self-assessment regarding cardiac care in the region/state.	
Presenter: Micah Panczyk Topic: Texas CARES Data ○ Texas CARES Q1 – Q4 2022 Data	Dr. Schulz presented, as Micah wasn't in attendance. He presented a summary of the SETRAC data for 2022. Demographic percentages across all three geographics locations SETRAC, State, and National the numbers haven't change much. Prehospital Metrics % Bystander CPR % (SETRAC 48.0%, Texas 45.0% and National 40.8%). Bystander AED (SETRAC 1.7%, Texas 1.9%, and National 1.5%). Initial Shockable rhythms % (SETRAC 15.6 %, Texas 15.5%, National 17.0%). ROSC (SETRAC 26.3 %, Texas 25.0%, National 26.7%). Overall survival rates % (SETRAC hospital admission 28.5 %, hospital discharge 11.3%, CPC 8.1%), (Texas 24.5%, 9.7%, 7.6%), (National 24.9%, 9.3%, 7.5%). Bystander witnessed and shockable rhythm by percentage (SETRAC Utstein 33.4%, Texas Utstein 31.2%, National Utstein 30.7%). Slides	The committee has no further recommendations

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	were shown to show a comparison of 2021 to 2022. It was shown that all percentages are moving up. We are moving in the right direction. Dr. Schulz reminded all members to submit all regional data. The more data we receive we can see where we stand, and to continue to see how we compare to the rest of state and the nation. A slide was shown with all the Texas Cares 2022 research publications.	
Presenter: Dr. Kevin Schulz Topic: 2023 Committee Goals Review/Update Regional Care Plan	Dr. Schulz spoke on the 2023 Committee Goals that were previously set. He discussed the committee participation in helping to achieve these goals. The 1 st focus is data submission requirements and in person attendance participation. Members in the group gave feedback suggesting changing the Cardiac start time to 9am, as this would allow more people to attend in-person. It was also suggested that the STEMI coordinators meetings be moved to the same dates. These changes will be reviewed and discussed future with the leaders and SETRAC team to accommodate all. There will be some changes to the future meetings times and dates. Dr. Schulz discussed the Regional ACS plan that was sent out for review and comments. The committee approved and agreed to move forward with the plan. The plan will be submitted to the Board for approval. Once that happens it will be posted on SETRAC website. The NCDR Chest Pain-MI Registry was discussed. It's still a pending agreement working to get access to that. The Hands-only CPR & STB community was discussed, and any volunteers are invited help to coordinate and participate in events. The Free-Standing Emergency Departments was discussed, as per Dr. Schulz; Suzanne Dominey has agreed to speak on Lytics. He also discussed ideas on how to get FSED increased for those that should carry Lytics. Dr. Schulz wants to get FSED involved with other communities and suggested to send out invites for the cardiac and stroke meetings to the FSED group listserv. Dr. Schulz thanked personally thanked Tonya Carter for all her help, and the whole SETRAC team	The committee has no further recommendations
