Presenter: Dr. Nichole Davis Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Meeting minutes from August 10, 2023, was approved with one change the next meeting date corrected from December to read October 12, 2023. Presenter: Diane Kaulen Topic: New Business - Mental Health Presentation - Texas Children's Hospital Roll Out of Zero Suicide	Diane Kaulen, Senior Community Initiatives Coordinator presented on the mental health work in the public health division of Texas Children's Hospital. She spoke on the process of their work where they were and hope to go. She gave a lot of pertinent, informative, and solutional information. In the initial data gathering prework they looked over the billing codes for suicide attempts, things billed for suicide attempts, suicide ideation, and self-injury behavior. They found a huge significant rise in suicide consult. They compared it with screening and found screening overall didn't impact the billing codes. A significant number of kids ages 5-10 were seeking treatment for suicide care that were not screened at 52%. Youth who died of suicide in Harris County had been in their system prior to death. 30% of kids were seen in the hospital some were seen 3 months prior to their death. Most are seen in TCPs - overall 2021 data they found most of the kids were coming in TPC and not ECs. Most screened negative many of them had a well check a year prior to their death. The details in the chart conversation/documentation showed the kids were stressing fatigue the only common theme from the data that they collected. It helped with the intervention support. Their suicide response and prevention workgroup were launched in January 2021 and completed tasks by March of 2022. They created six different workgroups that gathered significant data to help inform practice. They are in the process of research literature around suicide care in youth in a medical setting. Suicide Gatekeeper training empowered their teams to learn how to recognize the signs of suicidal ideation, open communication with someone who may be suicidal and how to point them toward available resources. In 3 months, they trained 14,000 employees. 88% provided positive feedback on suicide prevention. Training continues to be available through Voyager and recommend to all new employees. 16 teams 84 staff members attended a two-day training and planning session on zero suicide framework. 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Presenter: Dr. Nichole Davis Topic: Old Business - PECC Workshop Video Distribution Update - ASPR Grant - Knowledge Education Communication EMS for Children Innovation Improvement Center Meeting Update	The PECC workshop video is still available however data is no longer being collected it is closed for now and in the manuscript phase. The item will be removed from the agenda and brought back when there is an update. The ASPR Grant (G7) has officially been refunded for the second year. The pediatric preparedness for the healthcare professional course that came out of the education branch of G7 in the education domain was successfully piloted in Houston with seven deliveries throughout the Gulf Coast including another delivery in Texas, Dallas, every state in the Gulf Coast including Puerto Rico. It was well received the data is being looked at. There is a huge increase in knowledge and confidence. A survey will be sent out to see if it is clinical applicable with everyone. The plan is to roll out another seven deliveries in the spring of 2024. They will be looking for other location one in each state (Texas Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Puerto Rico, Louisiana) to broaden the reach of the course. It will be brought back to the committee when they have more initiatives and projects.	PECC Workshop deferred at this time.
Standing Reports Presenter: Jessica Yell Topic: Old Business - Pediatric Trauma Data Review - Q1 2023	Jessica reported on Q1 2023 data the report included data for 963 pediatric records ages 15 and younger from 32 facilities that were treated at all reporting facilities, not specifically pediatric facilities. Total trauma patients by most levels appeared to have stabilized with not much upward or downward trending for 2023 with the exception of Level I facilities which has seen a decrease for the 3 rd straight quarter. The number of patients brought to hospitals by EMS appear to be taken to the appropriate facilities. Level I facilities show 4 patients with a mortality for Quarter 1 2023. All other facilities show no mortalities for the quarter. Submersions are no longer included in the data and additional information will be sought to determine how close this mortality data is to the actual numbers. The “struck by against” and “motor vehicle occupant” categories have traded places back and forth over the years in the top 5 mechanisms of injury. Falls continues to be the leading cause of trauma. Future reports will include an age breakdown for the top 5 mechanisms of injury. A firearm injury report will be produced to include age ranges as well as the intent. Level I facilities reported a mortality rate of 0.2% for 2023. No mortalities were reported in the other designated trauma levels.	The committee has no further recommendations.



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Presenter: Eric Parmley Topic: Workgroup Initiatives - Community Hospital Outreach - NAT Heat Map	Eric mentioned including hospitals, EMS and freestanding EDs in community outreach. He presented a NAT Heat Map from January 2017 to the June 2023 for discussion. It may be something to keep on the radar for injury prevention to see what resources the patients have in the hotspot areas when released from the hospital. Eric suggested partnering and connecting with case managers and discharge managers from the facilities and agencies in those areas.	The committee has no further recommendations.
