Presenter: Dr. Brent Kaziny Topic: Old Business PECC Workshop Video Distribution Update	The PECC project officially went live. A pediatric emergency care coordinator workshop regarding the importance of PECC in both EMS settings, and hospital settings diving into two different tracks one for prehospital personnel and hospital base personnel. The presentations were recorded, and a way where they can be viewed virtually online along with some questions as part of the ongoing research effort. The project is currently in the data collection phase. Information regarding the project was sent out from Sam Vance, via EMS partnership program manager with EMS for children, and through the RAC systems. Promotional materials are out there for anyone interested there are links to the videos and the modules let Dr. Kaziny know if you are interested. Sam advised that PECC was presented at GETAC. ED Stop: Pediatric Suicide Webinar The Emergency Department Screening and Treatment Options for Pediatric (STOP) Suicide Quality Improvement (QI) Collaborative presented by the Emergency Medical Services for Children Innovation and Improvement Center (EIIIC) will run from February 2023 through November 2023. The purpose of the collaborative is to bring together ED-based teams from across the country with experts in pediatric mental health to exchange evidence-based best practices and optimize the care and follow-up of children and adolescents presented to the ED with acute suicidality. This collaborative provides an opportunity for those ED teams to collaborate with other ED teams across the country having access to unlimited based practices, collaborative educational sessions, resources, coaching sessions from pediatric mental health experts, network with other ED teams across the country to improve the care of children in their community all provided at no cost to the participants. Presenter: Heather Lozada Topic: Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)	Heather Lozada gave an overall review of the NPR mission, goals, and their first responders class held on October 28, 2022, at the Harris County Emergency Corps. The class was open to 24 participants with 4 on a waitlist as alternates. They had 11 instructors from five different locations around the RAC. All NRP objectives were taught per AAP recommendations. Results from the course survey were shown and recommendations for future courses. Their next steps are to have more classes. Many agencies have requested classes for their staff. The class will be promoted throughout all stakeholder members of SETRAC. Tracie and Heather will present at the EMS committee meeting on January 20, 2023.
