Presenter: Dr. Eason Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Kendra Folh welcomed everyone to the meeting. Meeting minutes from the June 14, 2023, meeting was approved with no changes. Presenter: Dr. Catherine Epps/Dr. Kelli Burroughs Topic: TCHMB Update - OB Committee Update Presenter: Dr. Elizabeth Eason Topic: Neonatal Committee - Newborn Admission Temperature Project	Dr. Weisoly spoke on behalf of Dr. Eason. He gave a brief update on the TCHMB project. He stated the presentation on this information will be at the TCHMB Summit. He reminded everyone the importance of data and reviewing their hospitals TCHMB data. He informed everyone about the survey that was sent out a few weeks ago to allow for input on the next Neonatal Committee project from TCHMB. Dr Weisoly highly suggest all that received it, please submit the survey. He stated the survey was only sent to Neonatal Medical Directors and Neonatal Program Managers for the Neonatal Committee vote.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Eugene Toy Maternal Mortality & Morbidity Workgroup Update:	Dr. Toy started off by thanking SETRAC, specifically for assisting with Placenta Adherence Spectrum Disorder (PASD.). He presented a slide showing great stats from the PASD so far. The numbers currently show 159 people signed up, 130 completed, 25 in progress. Test average score is 100%. He previously discussed the new rules for maternal designation that were established on January 8, 2023, requires that all hospitals screen for PASD. Dr. Toy acknowledged DSHS leadership for putting together the survey guidelines as its very informative and beneficial to have. Dr Toy stated other states are seeking for advice from TX on how we do things, as we are a state that is further along and the most organized when it comes to neonatal and maternal care. He stated there was previous discussion in his workgroup on what was positive, negative, what works and what doesn't with our LoMC process. He discussed what could be changed with our LoMC process. More consistency, better expectations, chart review process more consistent and transparent. He stated the question was previously asked if LoMC program be mandatory? Dr. Toy stated the answer was YES (unanimous) Should LoMC program be statutory (Tx Admin Code)? Yes!	The committee has no further recommendations.



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Presenter: Tracie Dauwe/Heather Lozada Topic: Perinatal Planning Workgroup EMS NRP Training	Heather starting off by reminding the members they are working toward improving morbidity and mortality rates by proving NRP to first responders. The goal is to increase the knowledge and comfort level of first responders providing Newborn Resuscitation to infants born outside of the hospital setting. Heather shows slides based on Pre-survey vs post-survey. The students take these surveys before and after taking the class. Surveys have shown improvements in their abilities since taking the class, the effectiveness of the course, and positive feedback on how much they enjoy the class. Heather also mentioned the supply drive for anyone that's interested in donating supplies. She told everyone that there is a NRP class held monthly here at SETRAC. She also reminded everyone about the large NRP class that's coming up in November and asked for any NRP instructors interested to please volunteer.	The committee has no further recommendations.
Presenter: Dr. Rebecca Ballard/Dr. Amir Khan Topic: Infant Mortality & Morbidity Workgroup	Dr. Ballard called in on zoom, she stated the workgroup just met on 9/11. The members discussed presenting their own projects to the group. Dr. Ballard stated in the Workgroup meeting she presented on Antibiotic Timeliness QI at MHTW, and there was great discussion on that. She stated tracking sheets are now available within Antibiotic Timeliness Toolkit on the SETRAC.org/perinatal website. She reminded everyone of the next upcoming meeting date and time. She stated that St. Joesph will present their long-term success without CLABSI at the next meeting in November and Childrens Memorial Hermann presentation will be at the following meeting in January 2024. She also mentioned all meeting times and days will change in 2024. Lastly, she mentioned the importance outreach and makings sure we continue to learn from each other. Dr. Ballard is asking all members to share what's working for their facilities Any collaborations with L&D or ER, anything being done to prevent kids from going into the NICU, any outreach with birthing centers or communities. She invited anyone to share any suggestions or good ideas. Dr. Molina discussed the groups focus on how they plan to improve their impact.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Weisoly/Jon Fry/Grace Farquhar Topic: Perinatal QI Workgroup	Grace started off with an update on the Data Submission for Neonatal and Maternal. She showed slides reflecting the Neonatal and Maternal data received vs. missing. Grace stated all facilities that hasn't submitted data has	The committee has no further recommendations



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	been notified already to please submit. She reminded all members that Q2 2023 data was due 8/31/23. She stated if they don't know who handles their data or hasn't submitted any data yet please reach out to SETRAC for assistance. Grace stated that plan is to get 100% of data submission across the board, as missing data negatively affects the numbers. She stressed the importance of having data submitted from all facilities. Dr. Weisoly presented slides on Neonatal Data Q1 2019-Q2 2023. There was open discussion on the slides. Overall, the data shows improvement. Dr. Weisoly again asked the members to please submit their data. He explained the purpose of that data. A few were slides on total inborn VLBW patients, total inborn LPI patients, total inborn and out born NICU patients, and total inborn and out born VLBW patients discharged from NICU as well. He stated just looking over the data, there is an opportunity for improvement. Dr. Weisoly reviewed a chart showing data that bring a concern "how many out born". He stated this is a dramatic increase over the last 3yrs. Dr. Weisoly also review some maternal data. He showed slides on maternal data from Q3 2021-Q2 2023. He showed slides on # of deliveries >20 weeks gestation and # of pregnant women with SBP> 160 or DBP>110. Again, Dr. weisoly stressed importance of submitted data.	
Presenter: Dr.Tiffany Molina Topic: Breastmilk at Discharge Project Update	Dr. Molina thanked all that participate the breastmilk and discharge work group over the years. She reminded the members of the project goals. She stated that she has seen some great changes with getting the data submitted. Certificates of merit will be awarded annually to facilities by SETRAC (Bronze, Silver and, Gold Levels) demonstrating achievement in breastmilk feeding. She discussed the new update for 2023 data thus far. She showed slides and discussed the project goals. The project goal to increase percentage of infants discharged on breastmilk by 10% by 1/2024. At least to 75%. She asked the question is it time to changing our time scale for review. There was open discussion on that. She discussed concerns raised and the proposal. Dr. Molina told the members that 2 additional questions will be added to database questionnaire. There was a motion from the members to approve. Dr. Molina asked for all in favor. Motion was approved. There was a motion to remove a question, that motion was approved as well.	The committee has no further recommendations



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Presenter: Audrey Barnett & Kate Drone Topic: Neonatal & Maternal Program Manager Meeting	Kate informed the group that their workgroup has been focused on the survey guidelines. She stated asking questions and getting clarification on things and working together is the goal. While using the survey guidelines as a guide, bringing the program managers together for great discussion and support, on an ongoing and consistent basics. Presenter: Joy Greenberg, PHARM-D Topic: Antibiotics Project	Joy Greenberg presented on project goals & updates. Joy showed slides on what bronze, silver and gold levels look like. She showed slides on the percentage of NICU infants receiving antibiotics more than 1hr after birth. The goal percentage of NICU infants receiving antibiotics in the first week of life more than 1h after order/birth (if order placed prior to birth). They previously voted in the meeting to update the project goal to decrease the percentage to 20% by June 2024. She was glad to update the members, they reached one of their goals to decrease that percentage to 20%. It was 31% when she last presented and its now 20%. She also talked about project group updates, sharing hospital program success stories and struggles, additional data measurement. The ultimate goal with having different projects present is to create future publication or poster for PAS. Joy reminded the member of the next meeting.	The committee has no further recommendations
