There is not a rule for EMS to put wristbands on the patients, but they are using wristbands in the hospitals. They have been given out to providers. The RAC made the initial purchase. It is an unfunded mandate. SETRAC has 5,000 bands that are available for evacuation and disasters when needed.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Mark Kelton Topic: HCA North Cypress IAP Level IV	Mark Kelton, Trauma Program Director with HCA HH North Cypress gave a presentation on HCA HH North Cypress Level IV trauma designation. HCA HH North Cypress services NW Harris County and Central Texas. It was founded in 2006 as a physician owned hospital. It was acquired in 2018 by HCA. They have 1,100 employees, 667 affiliated physicians, 163 licensed beds, and 27 ER beds, 20 ICU beds, and OBS beds. They offer bariatric care, cardiac & pulmonary rehab, Cath-lab, comprehensive cancer center, dialysis center, electrophysiology, emergency care services, endoscopy, hyperbaric medicine, infusion center, joint care, neurosurgery, outpatient lab, outpatient radiology, physical therapy & rehabilitation, radiation oncology, robotic assisted surgery, sleep center, sports medicine, stroke care, wound & lymphedema care. Their current state - non-designated for trauma, closed adult trauma centers, 2022 ER volume – 31,697 patients Level III/Memorial Hermann Cypress (7) – 2022 admissions – 9,407 patients	The committee has no further recommendations
