Presenter: Tiffany Purnell Topic: New Business - Best Practice Presentation - Harris County HVIP	Tiffany Purnell, Manager of Care Management with Harris Health Ben Taub Hospital presented on their R.I.S.E. Program. Tiffany gave a brief program overview. She shared the program's objective, engagement, and impact. The R.I.S.E. program was implemented in May 2023 via collaboration with Harris County Public Health with a goal to support individuals impacted by interpersonal violence with key trauma informed care to aid in resolving the gaps in safe discharges, mitigating retaliation, and preventing readmission. Engagement – The Hospital Recovery Coordinator (HRC) serves as a Liaison amongst both agencies, who navigates KPIs through case finding, collaborative care coordination and patient care support. Impact – Program outcome assist with improving participants coping skills and response to trauma, reducing recidivism and retaliation, and strengthening collaborative partnerships that collectively contribute to safe, effective discharge planning. Their HRC Response and Engagement Strategy was shared (Rapport, Education/Consent, Assessment, Therapeutic Intervention, and Handoff to HVIP) Current Data – Engagement Criteria – Individuals impacted by penetrating violence (i.e., GSW, Stab, Aggregated Assault) in targeted zip codes 77021, 77051, 77033, and 77090. They will be expanding to outlining area zip codes of 77004, 77023, 77030, 77047, 77048, and 77087. Engaged Candidates (potential candidates residing/injured in outlining zip codes) 37 total, average 4-6 monthly. Consented participants – 38 total, average 6-8 monthly. Secured Program Success *Therapeutic Interventions – 59% *Long Term Case Management – (i.e., ACCESS Harris) – 22% *Community Agency Linkage (i.e., Baker Ripley; Catholic Charities, etc., - 5 *Food Assistance (i.e., Food Boxes and Vouchers, etc.) – 7 *Clothing Assistance (i.e., Clothes by Faith Agency) – 4 *Employment Assistance (i.e., Amazon Job Fair) – 2 Trauma-Informed Services Approach Therapeutic Interventions	The committee has no further recommendations

She mentioned the fall health fair held in November was a success and they are looking to hosting one or two every year with one in an urban and rural area. They are looking at maybe the Southwest side of Houston and a rural area from SETRAC data. Kristen will check with Grace to pull data for the March meeting. As the committee prepare for the year committee leadership will meet to discuss ways to increase capacity. If anyone have suggestions, please reach out to her. There was discussion on having a session on logic modeling hearing from people who have gone through recent surveys sharing tips and barriers encountered. Presenter: Kristen Beckworth Topic: Workgroups Breakout Session - Falls - Traffic Safety - Motor Vehicle/Pedestrian - Drowning	Prior to Trauma Day the fall prevention and firearm safety workgroups met for 30 minutes before the injury prevention committee meeting to work on different projects and report at the injury prevention committee meeting. The workgroup meetings will continue via zoom on an as needed basis. There will be workgroup breakout sessions for falls, traffic safety (motor vehicle/pedestrian) and drowning during the injury prevention committee. Today the room was broken out into the three topics for 15 minutes. A leader was selected to lead the group in discussion and collaboration. Each group reported as follows Breakout Groups Report Kristen Beckworth and Group – Drowning Prevention The vision for drowning prevention for the next six months was discussed being that we live in a climate with an abundance of sunshine, pools opened year around, large areas of open bodies of water, and a huge burden of multi resident pool the group addressed. Drowning Prevention - Engage pool service providers, apartment pool maintenance personnel and those that service residential backyard pools with education on pool safety. - National resources available - National Drowning Prevention Alliance has a free toolkit for pool service providers to download for educational purposes when servicing and putting in pools. - Partnering with Learn to Swim Programs - Community events, some school districts that have Learn to Swim programs built into the school, some YMCAs have programs where they send traveling lifeguards around to apartment communities . - Engage with those groups that are already using Learn to Swim Programs as a platform to educate parents. Barriers - Burn out due to a lot of discussion around the subject. - Not thinking it will happen to them	The committee has no further recommendations



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	What is Needed • Get more local data to look at where the drownings are happening • Appropriate time for education is not at the hospital where a drowning has taken place. • REMINDER: On the SETRAC website there are tip sheets and drowning prevention education and information for apartment and residential available in English and Spanish to download. • Looking at a social media campaign purchasing a targeted Ad looking at zip codes where drownings are happening. Putting out a drowning prevention video that targets families living in those communities with kids of a certain age. That may require money further talk on that to figure support. Liza Garcia and Group - Fall Prevention Workgroup Their vision for the next six months is to look for the best program to see what resources on fall prevention will work for everyone. • They are working on a list of fall prevention resources for the best fall prevention program • They want to work on an EMS resource for non-transport for all patients. • For community events – they will be working on a health fair for the fall in a high injury level area. Alyssa Badillo and Group – Traffic Safety – Motor Vehicle/Pedestrian • Sarah Beth Abbott is going to work on a resource page with traffic safety specialists and other resources that will be easily accessible by the RAC when need collateral and/or contacts of people to get education out. • They spoke specifically on Wharton County and Matagorda County they are lacking a lot of safety standards. They will contact TxDot to get information, intervention, and data on those counties to get them up to the safety standard of Harris County • They will be partnering with Vision 0, an organization whose goal is by 2030 to have 0 vehicle related accidents. • Looking at maybe doing a community event with Vision 0 in 2024 partnering with the RAC.	



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	• Their group talked about meeting quarterly. Suzanne advised that the hospitals and Sheriff's office in Fort Bend County committed last year to doing a lot of swimming pools safety outreach because of the many pediatric drownings they had last year especially in the special needs community. Those in Fort Bend County may want to connect with the Fort Bend Sheriff's office. Kristen advised there is a brief drowning prevention PSA that SETRAC participated in with Fort Bend County leadership last year that may be an option as well.	
Presenter: Kristen Beckworth Topic: Open Discussion ○ Round the Room Updates	Kristen shared the upcoming injury and violence prevention educational conferences/meetings for 2024. April 11th Regional meeting – CAPE Day Texas Childrens Hospital and Childrens Memorial Hermann Hospital will be partnering in this event to increase capacity around child abuse prevention it is an all-day 8-5 in person only event. There is a nominal fee the registration link will be sent out through the listservs. It is a good way to get CME and CNE credit and learn about prevention strategies, resources and things happening in the region. Sarah Beth mentioned The Red Duke Trauma Symposium will be April 12th-13th at the Westin and registration is open. The Texas Impaired Driving Taskforce.org is hosting their 2024 Impaired Driving Forum in Austin, Texas it is free one day event and registration is open. March 8th Rice University Baker Institute Public Policy is hosting a half day event for after transportation safety for children in the Houston area focusing on pedestrian injuries, data advocacy, legislation change, planning, etc. as soon as the registration opens up Sarah Beth will send to Carrman to share through the listserv. Suzanne asked if anyone has any educational offerings coming up whether local, regional, or national to please send them to Carrman they will send them out through the listserv, so everyone is aware.
