Presenters: Dr. David Weisoly Topic: Call to Order and Approval of Minutes	Dr. Weisoly welcomed everyone to the meeting. Attendance will now be tracked by going to www.setrac.org/perinatal . This is where you will also enter your code words.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. David Weisoly Topic: New Business 2024 Smart Goals	Dr. Weisoly reminded the members that the Main Perinatal Committee meeting is coming up on April 3 rd at 1pm at Transtar. Dr. Weisoly reviewed the smart goals with the members. He stated, these rules are not set in stone, however they are set in place to work toward achieving them. 1st goal he discussed was the importance of having an updated record/ list of all contacts from all facilities. He believes this goal should be completed by mid-year. Dr. Weisoly reminded the members of the importance of participating and submitting data to achieve goal # 2 improving % of breastmilk at discharge and goal # 3 improving antibiotic timeliness %. Presenter: Dr. M Singhal/ Joy Greenberg Topic: Antibiotic Timeliness Workgroup Update	Joy Greenberg showed slides on their mission statement and goals. This workgroup's goal is to decrease the percentage of NICU infants receiving antibiotics in the first week of life more than 1hr after birth. She stated they are focused on restructuring their smart goals based on 2023 data. Joy showed slides and discussed the data trend from 2019-2023. She stated its sad to see, in 2022 they ended off at 28.5% and in 2023 ended off at 37.1% She stated that previous project goal was 20%, they will now be looking to revamp the project and set a new project goal. Joy also talked about upcoming group meetings, with different hospitals scheduled to share their success stories and struggles. Joy showed slides with data and discussed survey results. Some delays were lack of data, communication errors, lack of collaboration, environment, pharmacy challenges, and IV access challenges. Joy reviewed and reminded the members where the Antibiotic Timeliness toolkit is located on the SETRAC website, she stated there are great resources in the toolkit created by different programs. PASD was accepted and they are currently working on the finalizations for their project. She reminded everyone of the future meeting dates.	The committee has no further recommendations



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Presenter: Dr. A. Khan/ Dr. Rebecca Ballard Topic: Infant Mortality & Morbidity Workgroup Update	Dr. Rebecca Ballard invited members to present in this workgroup. She mentioned, Dr. Eason will be presenting next month on April 9 th . Dr. Ballard spoke generally about Congenital Syphilis. She stated this group hasn't come up with a unified project. However, based on the data on congenital syphilis, this would be something to consider working on. Dr. Weisoly suggested this workgroup start brainstorming and working toward a project for congenital syphilis by the end of the year.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Tiffany Molina/ Dr. R Rawalt Topic: Breastmilk at Discharge Workgroup Update	Dr. Tiffany Molina showed slides on the project goals. The project aim is by Jan 2024 they will increase the percent of infants discharged from SETRAC NICU's receiving mothers' own milk by 10% from 2021 rates. With project s updates, Dr. Molina reminded the members that the data metrics were updated for 2024. She stated they also updated the focus to look at the 3 different areas where moms and babies that has the biggest impact to improve: L& D, Post-Partum and NICU strategies. Dr. Molina did share that the PAS 2024 was accepted and will be presented May 5th. She slowed a slide and reviewed the new data base questions, effective January 1, 2024. She showed slides on focused strategies, L&D 2024 goals, postpartum 2024 goals and NICU 2024 goals. She reviewed and discussed the data so far in these areas. She discussed the project utilization with the Feb 2024 survey monkey results. 71% responded yes, they were able to find and use the SETRAC Breastmilk at Discharge Toolkit. She stated that we are slightly down from previous survey results of 98%. Dr. Molina reminded all members they are not obligated to use the tool kit; however, she does believe this is a resource to help get your projects going. She stated the next schedule meeting is April 9th. She invited all to volunteer to speak and share information and success stories at future meetings.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Fry/ Dr. Kulkarni/ Grace Farquhar Topic: Data Update	Grace gave the data update on Q1 2019-Q4-2023 Neonatal Data Submissions. She stated we are doing good with level 3 & level 4 with 100% completion rate. There is some level 2's that missing data and SETRAC has and will be contact. She states that level 1 isn't required	The committee has no further recommendations



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	to submit, but Grace thanked the few level 1 facilities that submitted anyway. Grace showed slides on the Maternal Data Submission from Q3-2021—Q4 2023. She stated in 2022 ,100% completion rate. For 2023, we are missing some data, but SETRAC has been in contact with these facilities and will follow-up to get that data. Grace thanked everyone that submits data on behalf of their facility. Grace stated in 2022 there was a goal for maternal and neonatal data submissions to be 100% to <i>turn the screen green</i>. She stated the number of data submissions in 2022-2023 greatly increased since the previous years. However, in 2022 we met the goal of 100%, but in 2023 we didn't meet the goal. She reminded that members that Q4-2023 data is due at the end of February 2024. She stated that reminders will go out through the data base to those facilities. Grace reminded the members that the SETRAC neonatal database has been updated. Data regarding cephalosporin administration is no longer required. Additional data regarding babies discharged on breastmilk have been added and is required as of January 2024. The data dictionary has also been updated. Grace stated, SETRAC is currently reviewing the number of VLBW patients transferred into and out of facilities. CEO reports are being created for distribution to designated NICU and Maternal facilities. She stated this report will go out bi-annually, but after the main Perinatal committee, so that's possibly July &* January.	
Topic: Open Discussion	Dr. Weisoly invited Melanie to give an update on NRP. Melanie was excited to share, SETRAC was able to get funding through senate bill 8, which is targeted toward EMS getting them through school. SETRAC was awarded funding to purchase supplies, eBook license renewal and pay for 100 medics to complete the online portion of NRP. This allows SETRAC to continue pushing the NRP program in the region. Melanie reminded the members that SETRAC can use some additional instructors to sign up. Dr. weisoly also asked and encouraged the members to sign up and help teach NRP.	The committee has no further recommendations
