New Business: Presenter: Zach Ward Topic: 2025 Co-Chair Nominations Presenter: Melanie Aluotto Topic: Board Updates Presenter: Dr. Charleta Guillory Topic: Neonatal Committee Newborn Admission Temperature Project	Zach started the meeting with new business, he discussed the upcoming nominations. He informed the members; all chair positions are open for reelection. The positions are for Hospital Representative, EMS Representative and Physician. There was a slide with a QR for nominations, which is open until October 1st. Melanie recapped on the latest board meeting. The Board meeting was August 27th. Melanie stated Dr. Eason reported out on Perinatal. Melanie stated our 1st perinatal regional plan was approved by the board. She stated others RACs were impressed and are interested at looking at our plan, as a guide. Grace added, there were re-elections between the board members, so there were no changes to the members on the current board. She stated the next meeting is October 21st 6:30pm. She welcomed all members that were interested the option to attend the meeting. Dr. Guillory gave an update on the TCHMB for Neonatal Committee. She is the Neonatal Specialist at Children's Baylor College of Medicine and the Chair of TCHMB. She talked about what they were working on. She stated the NAP project data analysis is completed. She stated the state-level report are complete, and in review with DSHS. DR. Guillory stated that the RAC specific reports and Hospital specific reports are currently in development. She stated they are very close to finishing these reports. Dr. Guillory talked about what's coming up next. Dissemination of reports* State- level reports housed on TCHMB website by early fall. Rac-level reports- sent to RAC Executive Directors and Hospital-level reports- sent to key contacts at each hospital. They will then move into publications- descriptions of clinical outcomes with a focus on incidence, disparities and trends over time and experience with statewide implementation-barriers and facilitators to hospital participation, project success, barriers and lessons learned. She showed a QR code for all scan to secure sponsorship and learn more about the submit. She also shared information with a QR code to scan on the 1 st TCHMB webinar 10/17/24. She gave more information and invite all to participates in these events. Dr. Burroughs and Dr. Epps wasn't in attendance. Dr. Guillory spoke on their behalf and mentioned the Congenital Syphilis Summitt, she stated they would appreciate all interested in participating.	
Presenter: Grace Farquhar - Data Updates/ CEO Reports Presenter: Dr. David Weisoly 2024 Data	Grace started with the SETRAC database summary. She showed data submissions for 2023 to January -June (2024) for Neonatal and Maternal Data Submissions. She reminded all that Data submission is required for SETRAC participation letters. Grace also let all members know they can contact her directly to see who is responsible from their facilities for reporting data to SETRAC. Grace.Farquhar@setrac.org. Grace told the members that Q3 data is due November 30 th . Grace also reminded the members the SETRAC neonatal database has been updated: data regarding cephalosporin administration is no longer required after December 2023. Additional data regarding babies discharge on breastmilk has been added and is now required beginning with January 2024 data. She mentioned, 2023 Hospital CEO reports were distributed to designated NICU and maternal facilities. They were sent out in mid-august. Grace informed all members, if they didn't receive CEO report, please email her directly. She stated that CEO reports now contain information for other service lines such as stroke and cardiac in one report. Dr. Weisoly gave the report on Neonatal Data Q1 2019- Q2-2024. He started with reviewing slides on Total Inborn VLBW Patients, data shows consistent numbers with the length of stays at 50-55 days. For total Inborn LPI patients' data shows previous years shows upward trend, but data now shows slight decrease from 2023- 12.0 to 2024 -10.8. DR. Weisoly showed slides on Total Inborn and Out-born NICU patients Q1-2019 to Q2-2024. % of NICU babies discharged on breastmilk is 69.8, 2023 was 70.4 overall improvement over the last few years. A new data measure was shown on % of NICU babies discharged receiving any mothers own milk at 28days of life	The committee has no further recommendations



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	(Dol) or discharge is Q1-2024-68.9% and Q2-69.8. Dr. Weisoly shared a slide on a concerning trend the % VLBW babies discharged on any breastmilk in 2023 was 57.3% but 2024 is currently at 44.8%. The goal for January 2024 >55%. He stated this an opportunity for improvement. He also showed slides on % of babies < 33 weeks, admit temp <36.5, and positive neonatal bloodstream infections which is trending down in the right direction. Dr. Weisoly showed slides on the admission antibiotics, and he gave a special thankyou to the leaders and all the members of that work group as the data shows improvement. The goal is 20% as of 2024 YTD we are at 27.3%. 2023 was 36.8% so there is progress shown here. He also showed slides on NICU mortality, VLBW mortality, Inborn VLBW mortality, out born VLBW mortality, VLBW average ventilator days, VLBW antenatal steroid administration, LPI all trending in the right direction. Dr. Weisoly showed a slide and briefly talked about data on VLBW Transfer IN's and OUT's to the different level facilities. Dr. Weisoly also showed slides on the maternal side. % of maternal patients with validated depression screening, the data shows it currently at 97.0% which he stated is impressive. % of maternal patients with validated substance use screening is 89%. He also showed slides on % of pregnant women receiving >4 units packed red blood cells=0.35%, % treatment of severe range BP within 60 minutes of recorded SBP>160 and/or DBP>110 =71.0%, which has dramatically increased and has continued to move in the right direction. There were a few questions and open discussion on the data that was reviewed.	
Presenter: Audrey Barnett & Kate Drone Topic: Neonatal & Maternal Program	Kate didn't have slides, but she reminded the members of this subcommittee smart goals. She stated this committee has been progressing through the smart goals very well. All goals will be met by the end of 2024. She stated this group will be working toward 2025 goals. She recapped on the most recent subcommittee meeting and the conversation on Hurricane Beryl impact. She reminded the members that SETRAC is here to help coordinate between emergency management at all facilities when there is a natural disaster.	The committee has no further recommendations

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- EMS NRP Training - Perinatal Disaster Plan Project	out the first responders as it there 50th anniversary EMS week May 19-25, 2024. Jennifer talked about the NRP for First Responders and the goal. The goal is to increase the knowledge and comfort level of first responders providing Newborn Resuscitation to infants born outside of the hospital setting. She talked all the success with the ongoing NRP classes. 173 first responders were taught NRP from October 2022-May 2024. She informed the members there is 2 upcoming classes scheduled in November. Jennifer stated in 2025, the plan is to bring the classes back to SETRAC, to ensure more instructor participation. She showed data results from surveys taken from the participant survey responses. The data has showed improvement and a really positive impact. She showed slides with data on the pre-assessment and post-assessment, which shows their confidence level, comfort level and skill levels. Jennifer informed the members, NRP instructors are still needed, if anyone is interested in signing up. She also invited all that's interested in hosting a class to reach out to SETRAC. Jennifer showed pictures from previous NRP events. She added information on funding that was received from SB8 grant which allowed for purchasing of 3 Neo-Natalie, 3 Neo-Intubation Trainers, and 100 licenses for the Paramedics to complete the online portion for NRP free of charge. She talked about the Perinatal Disaster Plan Project Taskforce. The first meeting held on august 28th, which consist of levels II- IV maternal and NICU representatives. They are reviewing all submitted disaster plans and they will create a goal based on that. Jennifer thanked all the facilities that created and submitted disaster plans to SETRAC.	
Presenter: Dr. Kelli Burroughs/ Aaron Roberts Topic: Maternal Subcommittee Update	Dr. Roberts recapped on the last subcommittee meeting. He stated there was discussion on a few areas of interest. He stated there was discussion on the mission and goals of this committee. They are looking into a project that would align with other project with current data collections being done already, which would avoid needing to get new data metrics. Dr. Aaron stated one of the projects would be reducing cesarean rates. He stated more to come.	The committee has no further recommendations

Presenter: Dr. Eugene Toy Maternal Mortality & Morbidity Workgroup Update	Dr. Toy started off with information on the application for best practice. The purpose is to collate a set of best practices in maternal care that other hospitals can use to improve their maternal healthcare. He shared the winners. Toy shared information on the DSHS Joint Biennial Report that was recently released on September 1st. He recommends that all hospitals read this Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity report. Dr. Toy highlighted a few different findings. #1- 42% of pregnancy-associated deaths from the 2020 case cohort were pregnancy related. #2- most pregnancy related deaths were preventable, (80% has some chance of being preventable) # 3- Six underlying causes if death accounted for 78% of all 2020 pregnancy related deaths (1-infection (25%), 2-CV(14%), 3-OB hemorrhage (14%), 4-VTE(11%), 5-CVA(7%), 6-mental health(7%). Some additional findings are disparities persist in pregnancy related mortality. The leading cause of pregnancy related deaths varies based on race and ethnicity. In 2020 the PRMR among non-Hispanic black women, roughly 2.5 times greater than that for non-Hispanic white women. Women 40 and older have a huge risk of mortality. Dr. Toy showed slides and reviewed charts with the percent of contributing factors by action level for 6 leading causes of pregnancy related deaths in 2019 vs. 2020. Dr. Toy informed the members to review this data, as the more data we have the smarter we are, and we can identify risk and how to screen for good intervention. Presenter: Dr. David Weisoly Topic: Neonatal Presentation	Dr. Weisoly shared information on a nationwide conference Neonatal Insights-Best Evidence and Practice in Clinical Neonatology, January 31-February 2, 2025 @ Memorial Hermann, Memorial City in Houston, Texas. He stated this conference is designed for Clinical Consensus-Building Conference, in a “mock courtroom” format. The purpose is for the entire care team to learn true clinical evidence behind best practices and bring consensus back to your own practice setting. Dr. Weisoly stated, with the support of SETRAC, this will be an opportunity for a Poster Session. He thanked SETRAC CEO, Lori Upton and Dr. Eason. There are slots for 12 poster presentations. He invited all interested to submit Abstracts or QI Project Summary for our SECTRAC Perinatal Post Session. 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Presenter: Dr. Ballard/Dr. Amy Tsai Topic: Infant Mortality & Morbidity Workgroup	Dr. Amy Tsai mentioned this group was considering a couple of projects and talked about the Congenital Syphilis Project. She stated this would be a possible joint project with Neonatal and Maternal coming together for the cause. She stated there has been a major increase in Texas and in the US for a few years. The CDC has put out Congenital Syphilis Call to Action due to the increase in syphilis in women of childbearing age. Data shows the Congenital Syphilis cases in the United States increased 755% during 2012-2021. In the state of Texas, it has increased by 300% since 2017. In July 2023 Houston Health Department issued a syphilis outbreak regarding 128% increase. Dr. Tsai shared how these effects on infants and what this can lead to, such as stillbirth, premature births or severe illness at births. Even complications later in life. She shared more information on treatments prior to delivery and infant treatment, which lowers the risk of disease but does not eliminate the risk. She shared a health department hotline# and went over things care teams can do. The goal is to improve the variation in data collection, treatment and processes involved in congenital syphilis. There was open discussion on this topic between the members.	The committee has no further recommendations
Presenter: Dr. Tiffany Molina/Dr. Rawalt Topic: Breastmilk at Discharge Project Update	Dr. Molina thanked all that participate the breastmilk and discharge work group over the years. She reminded the members of the project goals. She stated that she has seen some great changes with getting the data submitted. Dr. Molina reviewed the Q1-2019-Q2-2024 NICU babies discharged on any breastmilk slides. The goal is to get at least 75% of all babies discharged on any breastmilk, we are currently at 68.3 percent 2024 YTD. Dr. Molina showed a slide that is concerning, with a significant drop. VLBW babies discharged on any breastmilk regional goal is >55%. In 2023 we were 57.3% in we are currently at 43.8% in 2024. She stated this is something to focus on, to get this number back up by the end of the year. The project aim is by 1/2025 to increase/maintain the percentage of infants discharged from SETRAC NICU's on breastmilk as follows: All NICU admits (SETRAC Goal >75%) VLBW (BW<1500g) (SETRAC Goal >55%). Dr. Molina gave a special request to all members; please don't exclude any babies from the submitted data, as we are including all babies for the data metrics. She discussed the project goals and aims, focused strategies for L&D, focused strategies for postpartum, and focused strategies for NICU. Presenter: Dr. Nuthakki /Joy Greenberg, PHARM-D Topic: Antibiotics Project	Joy Greenberg started her presentation with a reminder of the project goals. The goal percentage of NICU infants receiving antibiotics in the first week of life more than 1h after order/birth (if order placed prior to birth). They previously voted in the meeting to update the project goal to decrease the percentage to 25% by December 2024. She discussed tiered strategies for improvement. -Hospitals are encouraged to form a combined NICU/Pharmacy Antibiotics Timeliness Task Force. – Resources can be found at www.setrac.org/perinatal . – Certificates of Merit will be awarded annually by SETRAC to units demonstrating achievement in timely antibiotics administration. she showed slides on Neonatal Data Q1-2019- Q2-2024. In December 2024, the number went back up to 37%. Currently, Q1-Q2 2024 has shown improvement, as we are currently at 27% close to the 25% goal. She showed slides on the percentage of NICU infants receiving antibiotics. Joy acknowledged the Gold level award hospitals. She also talked about project group updates, goals and sharing hospital program success stories and struggles, as well as additional data measurement. She reminded all members of the next meeting date and time, October 8, 10-11am.	The committee has no further recommendations
