Presenter: Suzanne Curran Topic: Community Education Workshop - Katy Area – Katy Mills Mall - Lone Star Safety Fest	Suzanne mentioned that Carrman found a number to call for the mall to see if and/or when we could come there to provide information for those walking and visiting the mall as that area has the highest number of adult falls. The Lone Star Safety Fest is scheduled for September 27th from 9:00am to 3:00pm, the same place as last year near Katy Mills Mall at Typhoon TX. We had a great turnout last year. SETRAC brought the AMBus. We had three tables where hospitals partnered with SETRAC, sharing information on pediatrics, injury prevention, household poisoning, car seat safety, hands on CPR and Stop the Bleed. If anyone would like to volunteer, please let Carrman know by August 1st. Suzanne asked if anyone had any health fairs going on or coming up that they needed participation and/or help with. Kristen Beckworth shared September 27th is National Seat Check Saturday. Car seat technicians around the country will be having a seat check event on that day. Their event will be held at Houston Community College (South Loop West where 59/610 come together next to Home Depot), those that are not going to the Safety Fest which she encourages, let her know as they will have tables available at their seat check event, they usually check around 100 seats. 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Presenter: Carrman Rivers Topic: Stop the Bleed	Suzanne mentioned stop the bleed continues to be busy Carrman has requests coming in every week. Carrman reported in the second quarter (April-June) there were 32 classes taught with 1,055 attendees. She asked those teaching classes to please submit their data to SETRAC as she reports quarterly to the Texas Stop the Bleed Coalition. Carrman thanked those who have volunteered to teach stop the bleed. She showed the upcoming classes with how many volunteers were needed and asked those who were able to volunteer to send her an email, and she will send them a meeting invite with the logistics.	
Presenter: Suzanne Curran Topic: Open Discussion Around the Room Updates	Suzanne discussed the upcoming world cup and got feedback from the group on community education specifically on stop the bleed. She wanted to know if getting a plan together to go out to the hotels, bars, and restaurants to educate their workers in preparation for the world cup was a good idea. Do we have a moral obligation to go out and educate due to the volume of people that will be at the event. LeAnne advised she didn't think it would be a bad idea to offer it to see how many people would be interested so we would have an idea of how many classes will be needed. Andrew asked if there were any established gathering places where we could hold the classes. A work group was mentioned to help with suggestions for the world cup. The topics of discussion were heatstroke, flyers with information to give to the hotels, bars, etc., and who would be responsible for cooling stations. It's still early SETRAC has not been asked to provide a cooling station. Upcoming conferences Carrman sent through the listserv information regarding an injury prevention conference 2025 registration is open the conference is in Austin November 4th and 5th. There is a flyer with a link for proposals and the submission guidelines. The Viper webinar series will be on Tuesday July 15th Impact of TX electronic sexual assault evidence kit. Dr. Hanna Rockford will discuss The Impact. Registration can be completed online. Kristen Beckworth shared Kids in Motion, a huge conference on child passenger safety in Wisconsin in August.
