They were given a huge gift from the Legislators they received 11 million instead of the 4 million they asked for. There are a lot of moving pieces. Troy Erbenraut SETRAC's Director of Emergency Services and Response went to a meeting in San Antonio he shared they are starting to work on when the money will be dispersed, where, and what is going to be attached to it. They want to make sure that they are allocating the money correctly. Suzanne and Troy will get together when he gets back from deployment from Hill Country to schedule a zoom call for all the trauma people. She will make sure that Dudley Wade is on the call he is the whole blood champion him Justin Reeves and Eric Bank from the EMS side. There are a lot of questions like who will be involved and how EMS comes into play. The project will include maternal, PI, and all those who receive blood products. Presenter: Melanie Bradshaw and Leslie Miller Topic: New Business Memorial Hermann the Woodlands Medical Center's Trauma Survivorship Program	Melanie Bradshaw gave a touching and inspiring presentation on trauma and mental health and the great lengths their trauma survivorship program has come in the 4 years providing support and help to trauma patients. Best practice is to screen when the patient is medically stable, has a GCS $\geq$ 14, <u>not</u> intoxicated or heavily medicated, and able to respond to the screening process. At MHTW they screen for PTSD (PC-PTSD-5) at discharge (since 2017). Informal assessments are made throughout their stay. Determinate screening is performed by the trauma nurse practitioner at discharge. Case studies were discussed she gave a victorious testimony on one of the case studies. She advised you must work on the program if you build it they will come. The steps in starting the program. - Research Their motto - Make a plan - Think Big, start small - Get key stakeholder buy in - Initial and long-term goals - What role they will play in the program - Marketing - How will you communicate the program	The committee has no further recommendations

The method of arrival to first hospital • AMB – 4,755 • HELI – 18 • NOT – 18 • OTHER – 11 • POL – 53 • POV – 4.549 Notable Findings/Changes – Adults • Decrease in double transfers from 2023 (30) to 2024 (21) • Increase in delayed transfers (greater than 120 mins) from 2023 (3014) to 2024 (3297) • Increase in timely ED discharge orders from 2023 (498) to 2024 (562) – Order ≤ 60 min • Increase in delayed transfers with ISS greater than 15 from 2023	The committee has no further recommendations



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	(364) to 2024 (377) • Relatively even split of delayed transfers on days of the week (higher Thurs to Sun) • Partial tier activation level has the highest number of delayed transfers (most often from Level III facilities n-1637 and level IV facilities n-659) Arrival to ED discharge order greater than or equal to 120 in 2024 was shown and discussed.

The survey needs to be completed by next Wednesday. There is a Webinar Junctional Tourniquets Dr. Berry shared at the last meeting there was a representative that demonstrated the junctional tourniquet. She wanted to get feedback from those who were in attendance or those who may have experience with the tourniquets. Dr. Berry asked if anyone had comments on it. Suzanne advised that the representative came to the RAC to ask if the tourniquets could be rolled out across the region, if EMS could deploy it, and if training was a possibility in the trauma centers on the next steps after the patient arrives. At the last meeting several people asked them to come and speak to their different committees to get more information. Dr. Berry advised she doesn't have enough information to decide. She will bring it back for discussion and maybe to the EMS committee to get their thoughts or feedback. ESO They are still working through some of the issues they were having. They were not able to get all the data for 2024; there were a few hospitals where everything didn't come through on our side correctly. They re-ran their data hopefully the next download will have all the data. On May 19th at 2:00pm Jorey will meet with the registrar admin and at 3:00pm there will be a training session with everyone that works with the registry.
