

#### **East Corridor Minutes**

### A. Call to Order

Lydia Worthen called the meeting to order at 1:04 pm.

# **B. Minutes** (C101)

Ms. Worthen requested review and approval of the May minutes. Christina Watkins (Mid-Jefferson) made a motion to approve the minutes, Trey Frankovich (Harris County Public Health) seconded the motion, and the corridor members carried the motion. The minutes were approved as written.

### C. New Business

• Maintaining Vigilance

Jeremy Way explained that the topic "Maintaining Vigilance" will become a standing agenda item, focused on reviewing recent incidents and identifying ways to improve preparedness and prevention efforts. He referenced the recent assassination of Charlie Kirk and the murder of a hotel staff member in Dallas as examples underscoring the need for heightened awareness. He emphasized the importance of staying alert and reiterated the principle: "If you see something, say something." Unfortunately, incidents like these are likely to become more frequent, especially with the World Cup approaching, so it's important that we all remain vigilant. There was discussion highlighting the significant struggles confronting EMS and Emergency Department teams.

• MCI (Mass Casualty Incident) Protocol Review

Mr. Way explained that while a regional MCI protocol exists, each individual agency maintains its own protocol, as the definition of an MCI can vary between agencies. He noted that the response to an MCI also depends on the resources available at the time. Mr. Way reviewed the various levels of MCI with the corridor members and encouraged them to review and familiarize themselves with their respective agency protocols. #### D. HPP Capabilities Review

World Cup Update

There was discussion around the potential language barriers for individuals coming from other countries to attend the World Cup, and the challenges this may present. Additionally, it was noted that events surrounding the World Cup may attract undesirable elements and large crowds. In this context, heightened awareness and effective communication will be essential. The CMOC will be activated for the duration of the World Cup.

Pulsara Update

SETRAC is continuing with in-house training for frontline staff (those receiving and entering patients). Two more in-house training courses are planned and then SETRAC will begin opening the training at facilities if there are enough staff members registered. SETRAC will then begin Pulsara training for EMS personnel. There was discussion on EMS using wristbands in certain areas.

# E. EMTF Update

- EMTF continues to maintain a presence in Kerr County providing force protection for the Texas Task Force and DPS Dive operations.
- Currently EMTF has 27 personnel in Kerr County Consisting of IMT LNO, TFL, two Peer Support, AO MIST, two ASTL, seven AST, and three MICU-UTV.

## EMTF 6 activity -

- August 7<sup>th</sup>, EMTF101 and EMTF Deployment Basics presentations at Medical Center of SETX in Port Arthur for Southeast Texas Nurses interested in participating in EMTF. Twenty ER nurses have an interest in participating with MMU, RN Strike Team, MIST, IDRU Hospital Augmentation Team. We will be scheduling training and MMU Orientation in SETX with dates forthcoming,
- August 19<sup>th</sup>, EMTF 6 held Regional EMTF Work Group Meetings and an initial after-action hot
  wash on the initial Kerrville flood response. A second hotwash will be held in October at the next
  regional EMTF work groups.
- EMTF 6 will be picking up equipment in San Antonio in the coming days: MMU Cache Replacement Supplies, IDRU replacement supplies, new radios and DME.
- EMTF 6 is sending an MMU to be reskinned and updated in September.

# F. Training and Exercise Update

Timothy Chapman reviewed the Training and Exercise Schedule distributed to the corridor members (copy filed with the minutes binder) highlighting the following:

- DSHS Bed Report: Due October 7th, with a completion window from 8:00 AM to 12:00 Noon.
- CMOC 101 classes have resumed at the Houston Emergency Center. Participants are encouraged to be familiar with EMResource, Pulsara, and WebEOC, as the course includes interactive training scenarios. Mr. Chapman is available by request to support technology training as needed; however, group classes are preferred for best learning outcomes.
- Supply Chain Integrity Form is due October 19th.
- MGT-439 Pediatric Disaster Response Course is scheduled for November 3rd-4th. Register via TEEX. Attendance is mandatory once registered as TEEX has stated that if turnout is low, courses will not be offered in the region again for 4–5 years.
- As a reminder, it is a requirement to have an annual decon refresher course. These courses are
  available by request and are held at the SETRAC warehouse. This course is also available to be
  conducted facilities as well.
- SETRAC is collaborating with various agencies to compile a list of Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) resources in response to recent requests, particularly in preparation for the upcoming World Cup. This resource list will be posted to the SETRAC website once compiled.

# G. Special Populations Update (C101)

Fidel Calvillo reported on the Special Populations events as follows:

- Planning with local jurisdiction for upcoming Emergency Preparedness Bootcamps in our Region on September 18<sup>th</sup> for South Corridor in Brazoria County. Bootcamps were held on June 24<sup>th</sup> in Montgomery County for West Corridor and August 14 East Corridor Chambers County.
- Participated with Texas HHSC Region 4 annual provider meetings (4) on emergency preparedness in August, with additional meetings on September 11.
- Providing SP presentations to community events and local committees.

- Continuing to work with new facilities to be part of RHPC and provide emergency preparedness guidance.
- Reached out to the TDEM STEAR Rep to discuss the new STEAR online registration for LTCS and home health/hospice providers.
- New EMResource event for LTC/ALFs to provide facility and operational updates during an event. Working with Juvare to improve event page.
- FSEDs meetings were held on July 17<sup>th</sup> and August 19<sup>th</sup> to discuss FIFA WC regional plans and patient tracking.

Updates were also provided on the construction of a new cancer center, expected to be completed by December or January, and a new integrated health center planned near Fannin. Additionally, an upcoming fire evacuation tabletop exercise is scheduled in collaboration with the fire department. There was also a report of two bus rollovers occurring within the same week in Liberty County.
