TOPIC	DISCUSSION/RECOMMENDATION	ACTION/FOLLOW-UP
Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: Call to Order/Approval of Minutes	Andrew Hiriart called the meeting to order. The minutes from the meeting on September 4, 2025, were approved by Trey Babino and Krisann Shoemaker. Andrew advised that attendance will now be tracked by going to https://www.setrac.org/trauma or the QR Code at the end of each meeting.	The committee has no further recommendations.
Presenter: Andrew Hiriart Topic: New Business National Trauma Data Standard	There was no data to review from 2025 (have not had any data for the entirety of 2025), this is due to known issues with ESO. Grace is working with them to have data to review at the first meeting in 2026. Andrew presented the slides sent by Brett Dodwell with the group, basically just going over his three slides on 2026 NTDS updates for the data field "Primary Medical Event" and how the definition was made more specific to certain exact conditions. Andrew advised that Brett wanted to get the slides to the committee to see if there were any questions as this was a preview of what he will be presenting at the trauma registry workshop. Andrew thinks it's very important to share with the registrars and data collectors since there are changes. Discussion was had on the new City dashboard that was recently highlighted in the news, and that of concern was the high number of pediatric accidental GSW. Trey Babino highlighted that this was an ongoing effort that will continue to collect data, and that we as a sub-committee should continue to educate the RAC on coding of these injuries for accuracy across the registries. The team agreed, and Andrew stated he would add it to his already planned FALL injury coding education at next year's Trauma Data Registry Workshop. Andrew described his plan for lecturing on Fall coding which will be sent out as a RAC wide IRR which is one of our ongoing 2025-2026 goals.	The committee has no further recommendations.

He asked if anyone in the meeting was part of the group helping with the lectures and if they had any comments, there were no comments. There will be CEs, Trauma Registry hours for those that are non-licensed, they are working on applying for nursing CEs for those that are nursing professionals. They will do a mixture of education for data collection professionals and trauma program managers touching on things for those who work in all the Levels (I, II, III, IV). There will be PI education for PI personnel and nurses they will also include education for those who work in rural sites Level IIIs and IVs that wear multiple hats and do everything. The workshop is free lunch provided it's a great event they have had much success over the past 5-6 years. Spread the word. Presenter: Rebecca Crocker/Andrew Hiriart Topic: Standing Reports ACS Trauma Rules Update	Rebecca Crocker couldn't attend the meeting. An update will be given at the next meeting.	The committee has no further recommendations.
Open Discussion Topic: RAC Wide Data Validation Exercise	Andrew spoke briefly about his plans to bring another exercise to the group. There was an exercise done previously where they talked about coding gunshot wounds. There was a big injury prevention push to get some changes underway whether coding undetermined intent, accidental, or assault they made changes so when it is unknown what to use it isn't thrown into an erroneous bucket. Andrew with some of the leaders developed 10 questions with 10 different gunshot scenarios and sent it out through the RAC, different individuals, groups, and hospitals came together and coded what they would use as the eCode. They collected the data from the 60 responses they received back they tabulated all the data there was a 60% agreement from that they provided education. He did a lecture at the last registry workshop on the results the exercise was resent out and they got a 90% agreement after the workshop. In the news there was a big City-wide project like the heatmap specific to GWS that the RAC is developing they found that there were a lot of pediatric gunshot wounds from the data from EMS, police and the level I trauma centers. 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	deal which they received funding for. Level I centers were involved in supplying and helping scrub some data for them. Andrew believes that it will continue. We are matching what they are doing, which is great. Eventually this data will be used for a TQIP poster and research projects in the future showing we have improved our validation process by testing and retesting. Andrew's goal for the next exercise will be focused on falls. There are many different types of falls. The goal is to have the registry staff not to use the same code for all falls. It is our number one mechanism and 65 % of all traumas. When we look at falls, we want to make sure we are coding accurately and specifically to accurately drive our injury prevention efforts. Andrew's plan is to do the same thing as with GWS 10 questions with 10 scenarios on falls the goal is to send it out as soon as possible to see what code should be used for the education in March. He will get together with Brett and Rebecca, the committee leaders and then send out the code they all agree upon. It will be sent out through the RAC. They will populate the data and present it in March at the Registry Workshop and share what the agreement rate is and have a discussion it will be resent in the Spring and compared. Everyone agreed. Andrew asked everyone to be on the lookout for the exercise.
