# Behavioral Health Resources

## Emergency Detention/ Order of Protective Custody Process (Harris County)



**EMERGENCY DETENTION**  
Sec. 573.001-Sec. 573.002  
A Peace Officer picks up a person from the community and takes them to the hospital.

Facility provides medical screening for patient in the ED.

Facility secures inpatient psychiatric bed and files order of protective custody with Probate Court (between 8:00 am and 3:30 pm)

**ORDER OF PROTECTIVE CUSTODY (OPC)**  
**OPC Issued**  
**Hospital and Pct 1 Constable notified by court.**

All EDO warrants are good for 48 hours. If a warrant expires on a weekend or legal holiday the patient may be detained until 4 pm on the first succeeding business day.

Constable receives order to transport, validates bed and notifies hospital of pick up.

Constable arrives to facility to transport patient within 8-12 hours of OPC.

**ORDER FOR TEMPORARY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES**  
Sec. 574.034  
An order for temporary mental health services shall state that treatment is for not longer than 45 days, except the order may specify a period not to exceed 90 days if the judge finds that the longer period is necessary.

**PROBABLE CAUSE HEARING**  
Sec. 574.025  
A hearing must be held within 72 hours of the Order of Protective Custody being signed. If the patient is still in the ED, the facility must arrange for access to the patient for probable cause hearing (teleconference).

# Behavioral Health Information

In Texas mental health law, emergency detention order (EDO) is the initial act by police taking someone in crisis for immediate evaluation (up to 48 hrs), while an Order of Protective Custody (OPC) is a court order extending that detention beyond 48 hours, allowing for further evaluation and potential court-ordered treatment, bridging the gap until a full mental health hearing occurs, ensuring care for someone a doctor deems a danger to themselves or others. An OPC follows an EDO and authorizes holding the person longer for assessment, with a probable cause hearing within 72 hours to justify continued detention.

A facility that has admitted a person on an EDO basis may transport that person to another suitable mental health facility if certain conditions are met, which often includes the written consent of the administrator of the receiving hospital and coordination with the Local Mental Health Authority (LMHA).

In essence, an EDO provides the legal basis for initial transport and examination, and subsequent transfer requires adherence to specific legal procedures and medical evaluations to ensure the patient's rights are protected and the transfer is medically appropriate. The EDO itself is not the sole, long-term authorization for indefinite inpatient care.
