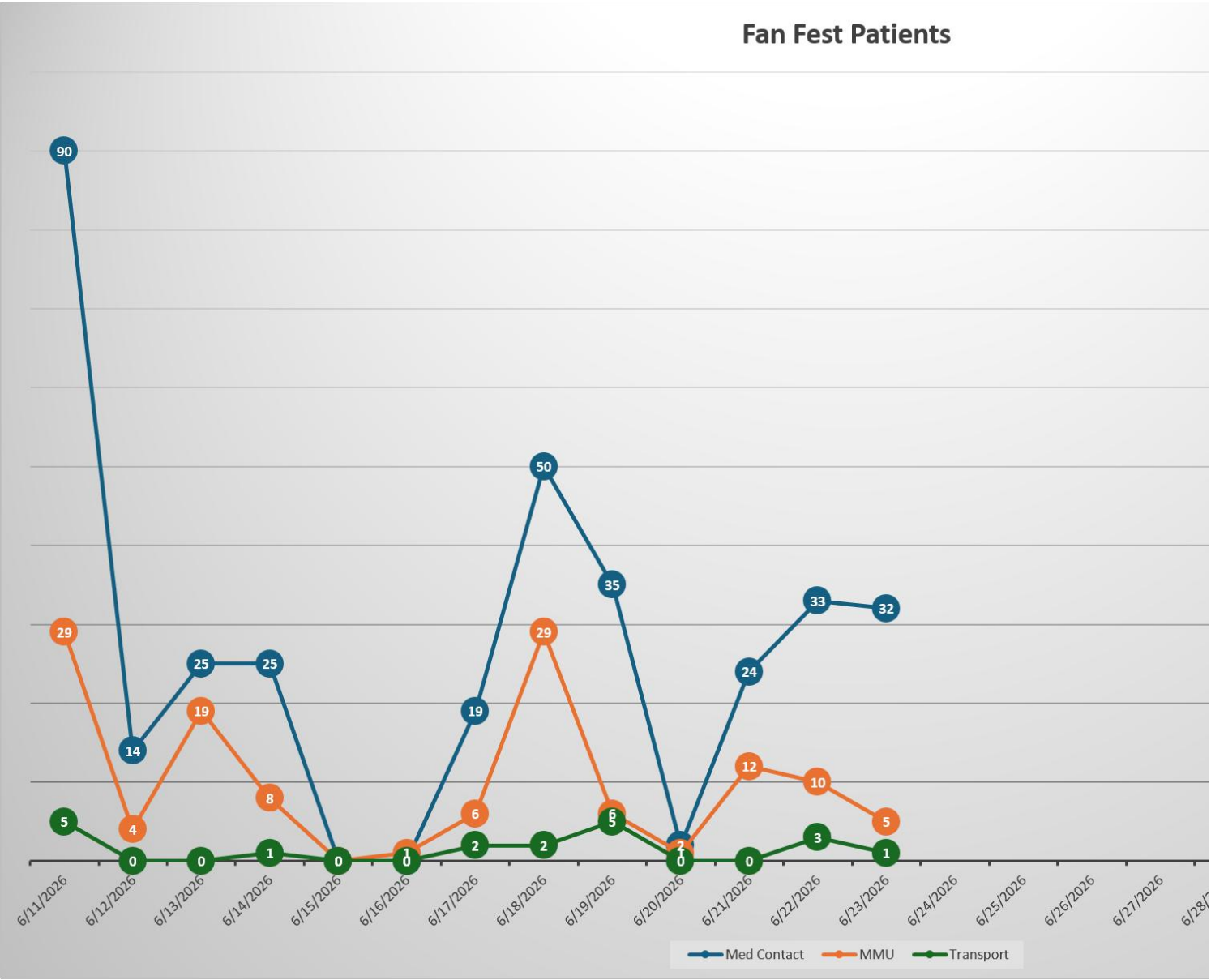
- 06/23/2026 – match @ Houston Stadium with 12 noon start time.

- No issues reported

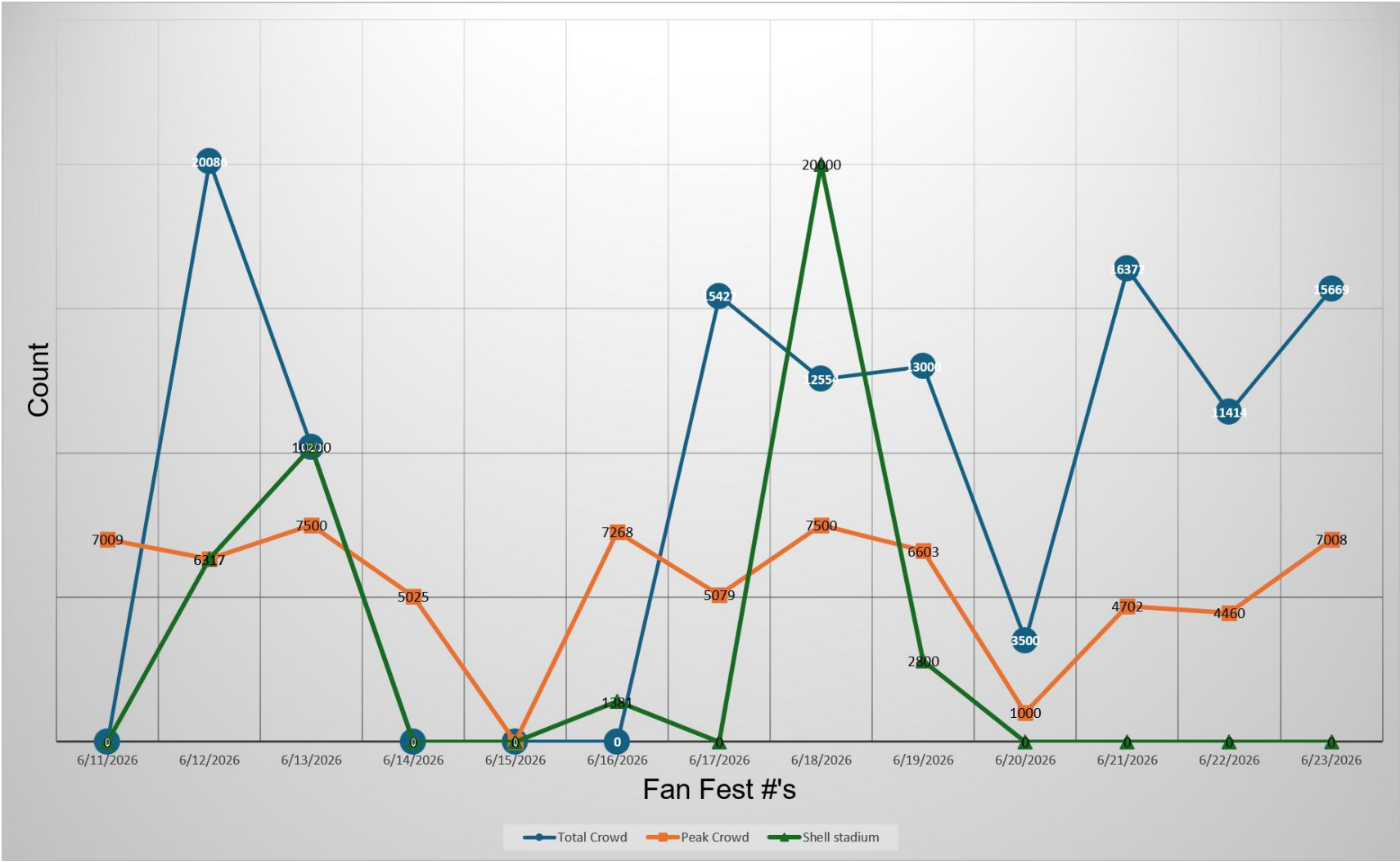

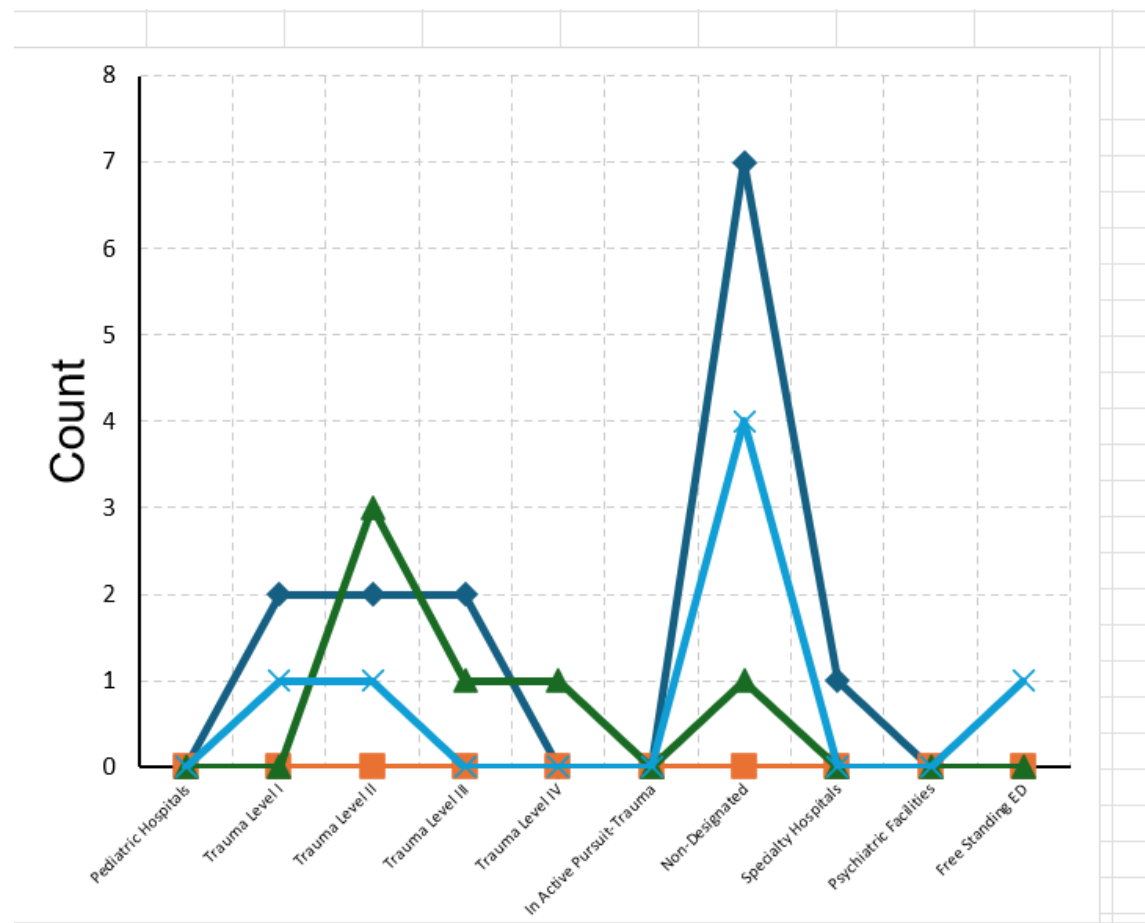

ROAD CLOSURES AND TRAFFIC

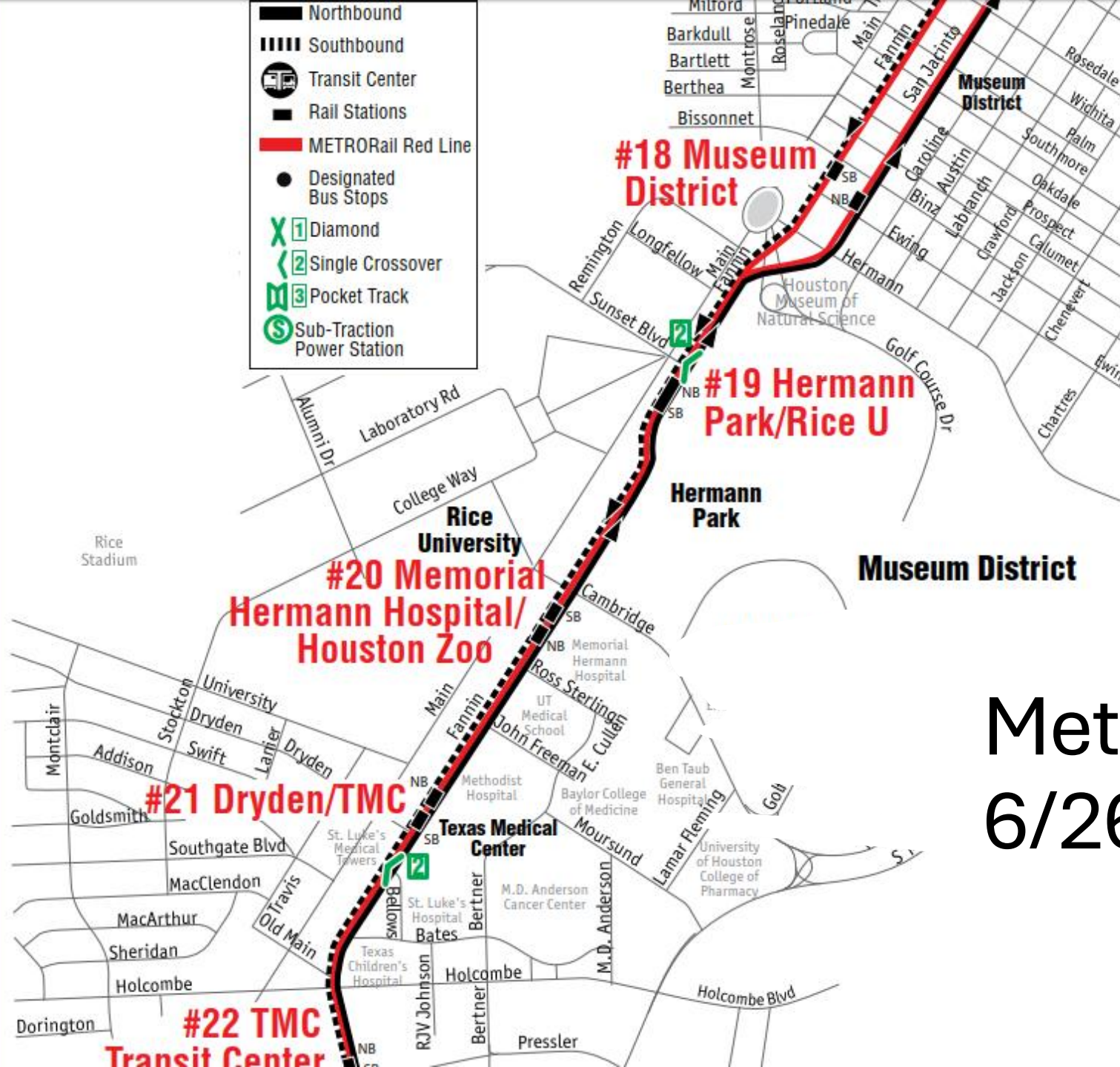


Closures may begin as much as 6 hours before the game and 2 hours after the game ends. This will affect staff arriving and departing from their shifts.

Slow spots to watch west/south Loop 610 (especially near the stadium), I-45 South from downtown toward NRG, US-59, and Texas 288. Secondary roads near NRG like Bellaire, West University, South Main, Fannin, and Richmond Ave

HPD will establish the official perimeter, we suggest you expect security perimeters similar to Rodeo or Super Bowl – these may include full or partial closures on match days of: Kirby Drive (especially near McNee Rd and Westridge), Fannin Street near the stadium perimeter, Murworth Drive, Lantern Point Drive, Stadium Drive / NRG Park

PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE IN EXTREME HEAT IN HOUSTON

HOUSTON HEAT IS NO JOKE. HIGH TEMPS. HIGH HUMIDITY. HIGH RISK.

EXTREME HEAT CAN BE DANGEROUS. TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF, YOUR LOVED ONES, AND YOUR COMMUNITY.

 STAY HYDRATED Drink plenty of water throughout the day, even if you don't feel thirsty. AVOID ALCOHOL AND CAFFEINE.	 SEEK SHADE AND COOL PLACES Limit time outdoors, especially between 10 AM and 4 PM. Use parks, shaded areas, and cooling centers when needed.	 DRESS FOR THE HEAT Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing. Use a hat and sunglasses for extra protection.	 KEEP YOUR HOME COOL Use air conditioning if you have it. Close blinds during the day and run fans to keep air moving. NEVER LEAVE KIDS OR PETS IN CARS.	 CHECK ON OTHERS Check on elderly neighbors, family, and friends. Heat can be especially dangerous for young children and seniors.
 KNOW THE SIGNS OF HEAT ILLNESS • Heavy sweating • Dizziness • Nausea • Headache • Rapid heartbeat • Confusion ACT FAST. COOL DOWN. DRINK WATER. GET HELP.	 PROTECT YOUR PETS Pets can overheat quickly. Always provide shade and fresh water. Walk pets early in the morning or evening on hot days.	 BE CAREFUL AT WORK If you work outdoors, take frequent breaks in the shade, drink water often, and pace yourself. Know your limits.	 STAY SAFE IN YOUR CAR Never leave anyone in a parked car. 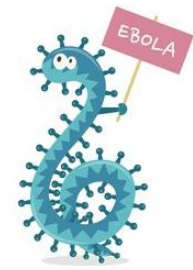

- DRC has 1094 confirmed cases w/277 confirmed deaths
- Uganda reported 20 confirmed with 2 confirmed deaths
- South Sudan reports 0 confirmed and 0 deaths
- No confirmed in the US

RISK TO US PUBLIC REMAINS LOW!

- As of the report on 6/22/2026:
 - 269 PUM in Texas
 - 52 in SETRAC 25 county region (19%)
 - **Regional IDRU plans in place**

FIFA MISSING PERSONS REPORT



Should someone arrive at your facility looking for a sick or injured person. (Related to the FIFA World Cup)

We are providing access to a form that is available in multiple languages to assist with reporting a missing person.

NOTE: This is meant to be utilized if the missing person is presumed to be part of the FIFA event, as either a participant or a fan.

Steps to follow if someone comes to your facility looking for a missing person:

1. Determine if the missing person is at your facility and follow your normal process for reunification if they are located at your facility.
2. If they are not at your facility, utilize the missing persons form found at this URL.

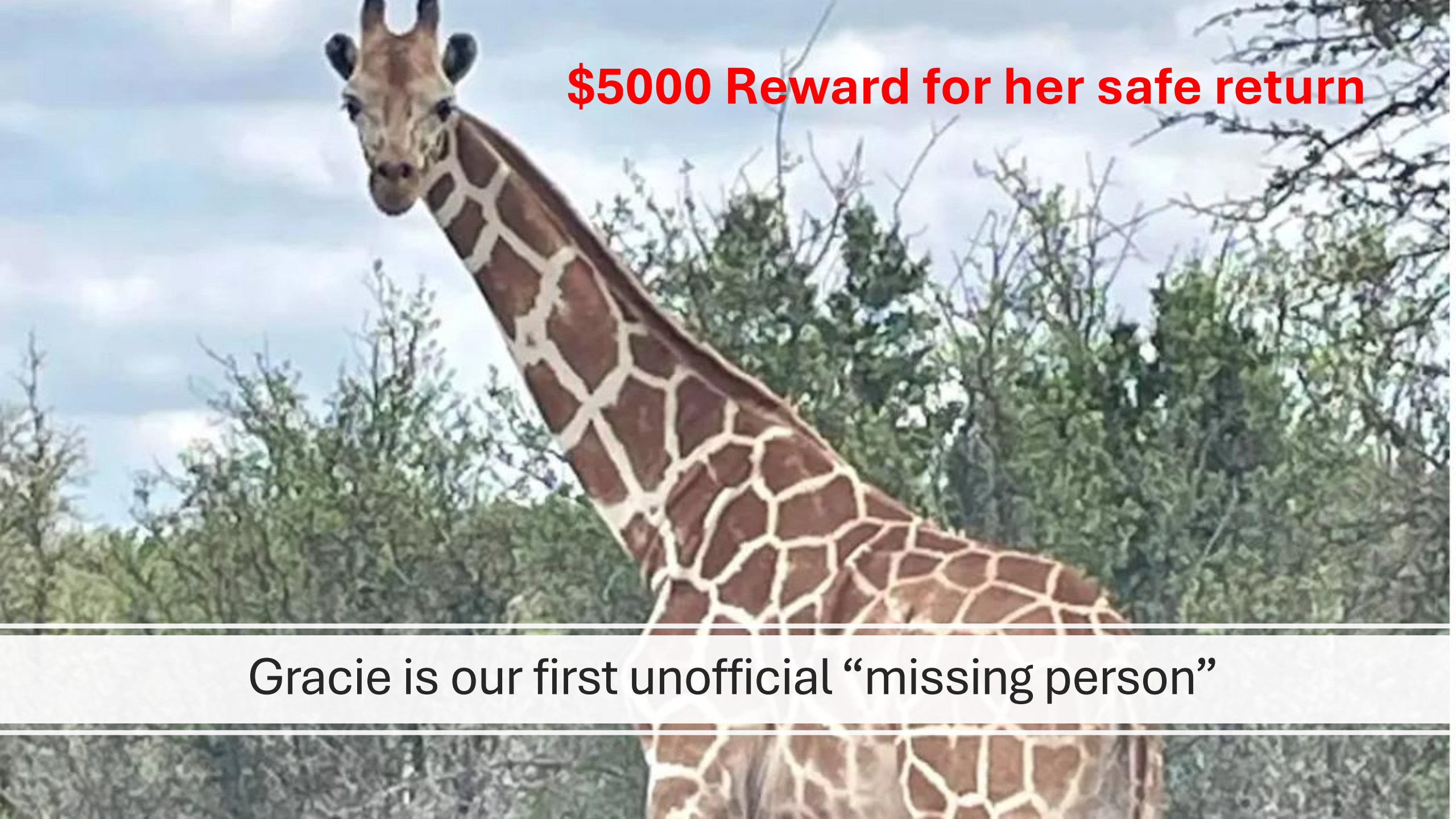

A NATION AT THE BRINK

In the final days before independence,
America's future was being decided.
The outcome was uncertain.
The courage was real.

CONGRESS DEBATED INDEPENDENCE

On this day, Congress continued debating Richard Henry Lee's resolution that "these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States."

A DECLARATION BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, IN GENERAL CONGRESS ASSEMBLED.

W H E N the United Colonies by these presents do declare and do hereby declare that the United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all future attempts by the King of Great Britain to invade the rights of the Colonies, and to exercise tyrannical power over them, shall be regarded as breaches of the compact between the Colonies and the King of Great Britain, and as justifications of the Colonies in the war they have waged for their freedom and independence.

THE DECLARATION WAS BEING WRITTEN

The Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson leading the draft, was creating the words that would declare a new nation to the world.

THE COLONIES WERE BECOMING STATES

Colonial legislatures sent instructions to their delegates—many authorizing them to vote for independence. The commitment was growing, but not all were yet convinced.

THE WAR COULD STILL BE LOST

British forces were preparing a massive invasion. The future of the colonies—and the dream of independence—hung in the balance.
